CONFIRMATION 2019

Preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, for those young people in Year 9 or above, will commence in November. Application forms are available after all Masses throughout September. Completed forms and copies of the Baptismal Certificate must be returned to the parish office by Monday 8th October.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2019

Preparation for First Communion in 2019 starts next Sunday 9th September, with a meeting for the Parents of all children who are being prepared. Attendance at this meeting is important, and it takes place in the undercroft at 8.00pm.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY

Children's Liturgy, recommences 8th September, and is an important ministry in our parish. It runs during term time in the Undercroft at the 9.45am Mass. It aims to explain the Gospel teaching to our younger

parishioners in a way which is meaningful to them. The lesson is suitable for Reception age children and above.
