These days of Lent are a time to repent, to change our ways. Not infrequently it's, perhaps, all too easy to get into certain ways or habits which may mean that we are not doing things as well as we might. And in our life of faith it may mean that we're cutting corners, that we are not being as wholehearted as we could be. There is always room to do better. Of all the things we do to nourish our faith participating in the Eucharist is surely the most important, the "source and summit of the Christian life". And indeed, we demonstrate our appreciation of the gift of the Eucharist by the time we give to it.

Sometimes the question is asked: 'How much of the Mass do I need to attend to fulfil my obligation?' The short answer is: all of the Mass, put simply you do your duty by being present when the celebrant arrives on the sanctuary and then remaining until he leaves, or the last hymn, which is the final prayer, has been sung. It can be disappointing to see people leave after receiving Holy Communion. Would you go for dinner with someone, eat and then leave without spending more time, and saying 'thank you'?

Lent is a time for us to look at what we do, at how wholehearted we are, at how appreciative we are of the gifts God has given us. And so, it is a time, where necessary, where we can change and do better, and allow our actions to express our gratefulness to God for the gifts He has given us.
