Jesus pulls no punches in today's Gospel text about the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. Typically, he chooses as his characters first one who sees himself as the most upright and religious and then the other who is despised by everyone. The Pharisee's prayer says it all: 'I' thank you, God, that 'I' am not grasping, unjust and adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that 'I' am not like this Tax Collector here. 'I' fast twice a week; 'I' pay tithes on all 'I' get.

The Tax Collector on the other hand knows how unworthy he is and implores God for mercy. He is not comparing himself to other people but comparing himself to God and finding himself wanting. He knows his sins; they are always before him.

The Tax Collector is a humble man, and this is precisely what true humility consists in; not comparing ourselves to others but comparing ourselves to God, or perhaps more easily to Jesus his incarnate Son. When we do this, we begin to see ourselves in the correct light; we begin to see ourselves in true perspective. We realise that before God we are absolutely nothing. In comparison to Jesus we are utterly hopeless but, in his mercy, God saves us and raises us up. He forgives the contrite heart.

To be humble may sound like a place of weakness, in fact it is anything but. When we are humble, we know ourselves as we are; and when we know ourselves, then we know our need of God, and when we recognise that need, we are not in a situation of weakness, but in a place of strength.

Next Friday is the feast of All Saints, and is a holyday of obligation. Masses will be celebrated at 9.15am and 6.00pm. On holydays, of which there are now very few, we are obliged to attend Mass in addition to our Sunday obligation.

## ALL SOULS

Next Saturday, All Souls Day, we remember all the souls in purgatory, those who have still to complete their journey to God. Mass will be celebrated at 10.00am.

## HOLY SOULS

November, traditionally, we remember, and assist with our prayers, all the souls in Purgatory. There will be a number of Masses offered for this intention during the month. ## FROM THE CARDINAL

Enclosed with this newsletter is a message from Cardinal Nichols. Tomorrow, Monday for two weeks, the Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse will be examining the situation of the Roman Catholic Church in England and Wales. Cardinal Nichols will be appearing before the enquiry and, as he says, it will provide an opportunity "to offer again an apology to all who have suffered in the context of the Catholic Church .... As well as to offer assurance of our willingness to learn further lessons about how to improve and strengthen our response to those who have suffered and our work of safeguarding". The Cardinal asks that we continue to pray for all who carry the heavy burden of abuse every day.
