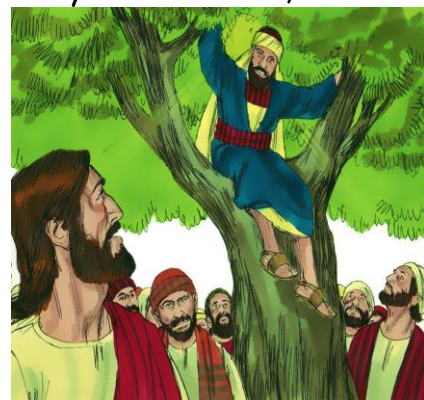

Whatever his faults, and his reputation, may have been, Zacchaeus took great trouble to look for some contact with Jesus. He wanted to see "what kind of man Jesus was". You could say that he was simply being nosy ... he was just curious about Jesus. Curiosity can sometimes be somewhat negative, seeking information simply for its own sake. Zacchaeus though, had a real interest in seeing Jesus, in discovering "what kind of man he was".

For this, he was prepared, quite literally, to go out on a limb, to climb on to a leafy branch of a sycamore tree. He went to extravagant lengths to see Jesus, to really encounter him. In the process he found that the one he was searching for was also searching for him. "Come down, for I must stay at your house today," said Jesus.

From his perch among the branches, Zacchaeus was amazed to be called to share a dinner with Jesus. When he threw open his house to Jesus and spoke of reforming his life, he received a greater gift in return, a welcome back to his community of faith. "Today, salvation has come to his house, because this man too is a son of Abraham."

There was a place in God's house for Zacchaeus, as there is for all of us. He was warmly welcomed in spite of his past. As in the case of Zacchaeus, our searching for God is preceded by God's search for us. Like Zacchaeus we can have a healthy curiosity about Jesus, and whenever we do so, when we seek his presence, we will find that Jesus is already there, ready to receive us, and to sit at table with us.

SAFEGUARDING IN THE CHURCH

From October 28th until November 8th the Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse is examining the situation of the Roman Catholic Church in England and Wales. Cardinal Nichols will be appearing before the enquiry and, as he says, it will provide an opportunity "to offer again an apology to all who have suffered in the context of the Catholic Church As well as to offer assurance of our willingness to learn further lessons about how to improve and strengthen our response to those who have suffered and our work of safeguarding". Last week a message from the Cardinal was circulated in connection with the hearing. Most importantly, the Cardinal asks that we continue to pray for all who carry the heavy burden of abuse every day.

PATHWAYS TO HOLINESS

Through Baptism we are called to be holy, and we can be inspired by the saints who have gone that way before us. Commencing on Tuesday November 12th we have a series of four talks on 'Pathways to Holiness'. We will be reflecting on the lives of three saints of comparatively recent times. The first two talks will be on the recently canonized St John Henry Newman; and that talk will be given by Fr Gerard Skinner, Parish Priest of Notting Hill, and author of 'Newman the Priest - Father of Souls'. The talks take place in the undercroft, starting at 7.30pm.

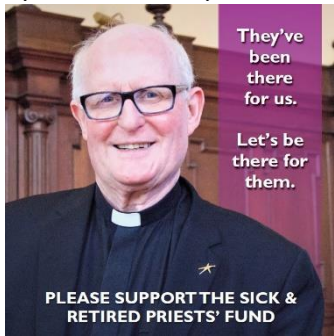
CONFIRMATION 2020
