King*  
S U N D A Y

Today we honour Christ the King. In some ways it might seem to be a strange feast to be keeping - perhaps strange to be honouring Christ as a King rather, say, than as a shepherd. If it seems strange, or doesn't sit easily with us, that may be because of the kingship we are familiar with. The kingships of this world which are normally associated with wealth and palaces, with power and prestige and influence.

This feast is a reminder of the place that Christ should occupy in our lives. He should be at the centre of our lives, and occupy first place, above all others. He is the one to whom we must give our loyalty, the one to whom we must submit ourselves.

We are invited to acknowledge Christ as our King; and to do so is to accept his ways, his values, his truth - and to accept without reservation, without compromise. That is surely a tall order - it may not sit too easily - but that is what is asked if we are to submit ourselves to him. For most of us it is a question of quiet simply striving towards the way that Christ has set before us - striving, continually trying - and the more we allow ourselves to take on his ways then the more we see the wisdom of them.

Christ, our king, wants us to commit ourselves to a particular way of life because quite simply he wants the best for us - after all he is the true shepherd. So, let us acknowledge Christ as king - let us renew our commitment to him and his kingdom which is unlike any king or kingdom the world has ever known.

## PATHWAYS TO HOLINESS

On Tuesday evening, we continue our series of talks, 'Pathways to Holiness'. This week the talk will be on St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein). St Teresa was born a Jew, converted to Catholicism, going on to become a Carmelite nun, and died in [Auschwitz](#) in 1942.

The talk this week will be given by Father Matt Blake, a Carmelite friar, and expert on Carmelite Spirituality. If you haven't yet been to one of the talks do think about attending, and familiarising yourself with another of the heroes of our faith. The talks take place on Tuesdays in the undercroft at 7.30pm
