In today's Gospel, John the Baptist is inviting us to look at Jesus. When we begin to look at Jesus, then we come to know Jesus, and the more we look, the more we discover, and the more we want to know.

John calls Jesus the 'lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world'. We say these words at every mass and today we are invited to meditate on them more closely. What does it mean? In Jesus' time, two lambs were sacrificed in the Temple in Jerusalem each day. Jesus will preach a love that is radical for many, in a world that was, and still is, broken. John refers to Jesus as the lamb as he knows that if one loves in such a way, they will suffer at the hands of unjust systems and institutions.

When we look at the 'sins' of our world today - broken relationships, crisis, can we also see those who, like Jesus, 'take away' the sins of the world? Christ's love was not passive, he actively challenged systems that were oppressive and which prevented people from living life to the full. Whether it be the climate crisis or the homelessness crisis or any number of issues we face, 'look' where Jesus walks and is actively working to ease this suffering.

When we hear these words at mass, let us be reminded of all those who sacrifice much to ease the sufferings of others. This is Christ, the 'lamb of God' active in our world today. Let us continue to look at, and look for, Jesus and grow in our awareness of his transforming presence active in our world today.

## PRAYING FOR UNITY

Each year from January 18<sup>th</sup> until 25<sup>th</sup> we are invited to heed the prayer of Jesus: that "they may be one so that the world may believe" (John 17.21), and to pray for unity amongst all Christians. This year the theme for the week is: "They showed us unusual kindness" Acts 28:2. In this, Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, let us remember this intention in our prayer, that the prayer of Christ may come to fruition.

## EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Each time we come for Mass we receive, and worship, Jesus in the gift of the Eucharist. Outside of Mass, we can also worship Jesus in this precious gift. Every Saturday evening the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in Church between 5pm and 5.40pm. Confession is also available from 5pm - 5.30pm. A lovely opportunity for some peace and quiet; come along even if for a few minutes. Please respect the silence if you are arriving early for the Vigil Mass.



## MASS OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

At the heart of Jesus' ministry was the healing of the sick. That ministry the Church continues to exercise, reaching out to those in need of healing through the Sacrament of Anointing. On Sunday, 9<sup>th</sup> February at 3.00pm, to celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes which is on 11<sup>th</sup>, there will be an opportunity for those "whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age", to receive this Sacrament during Mass.
