It's quite an extraordinary Gospel reading that we hear today!

We have an encounter between two people of different, indeed opposing, religious backgrounds - Jesus the Jew and the Samaritan Woman. But they engage in conversation, a conversation which does not avoid what divides them, and Jesus seems to have no discomfort or difficulty in talking to the woman.

There are two aspects to the story - the dialogue with the diversity of belief in our society, and the breakdown of marriage and family life - we think of as being very modern, very challenging, very different, very new. How does Jesus deal with it?

Firstly, Jesus doesn't condemn the woman. He doesn't denounce her as a sinner, or criticise her faith. He speaks to her and he listens, too. He treats her with dignity and with respect. But he doesn't condone her either. He doesn't say, or even imply, that all beliefs, all faiths are the same. He stands his ground, and speaks for the truth.

He does though, offer her God's blessing, openly and freely. The living water is for her as much as it is for anyone else. He does not tell her that God's grace is refused to her because of her way of life or even her background. It is offered to all, without favour. It is not a reward for goodness - but hope for sinners.

And finally, he sends her out to spread the word. He invites her response and she reacts with enthusiasm. She tells others about him, and they are drawn to him. She becomes a messenger for the truth, a witness for the Gospel, a herald of the Christ, a minister of grace.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

A traditional Lenten devotion, the Stations of the Cross take us through the last events of Our Lord's life to his death on Calvary. On this journey we are assisted by the inspiring artwork of the Stations in church. Stations of the Cross takes place each Sunday, of Lent, at 6.00pm.

LENTEN ALMS

It is customary during Lent to donate what we save through our self-denial to a charitable purpose. We will be sending anything that is donated to the Cardinal's Lenten Appeal, which will be used to strengthen marriage and family life, inspire young people in their faith and serve those in need in our communities. You can leave any contributions in the box on the wall near Our Lady's altar. Alternatively, if you would like to Gift Aid your donation, envelopes can be found in the porch and your donation then posted through the Presbytery door/Parish Office.

LOOKING AFTER OURSELVES & EACH OTHER

Last week it was announced that, while the possibility of the Coronavirus remains, the Sign of Peace, and Communion under Both Kinds would be suspended, and it was requested that **everyone receives Holy Communion in the hand**. Following further advice received from the Diocese, starting this Sunday **the offertory collection will take place as you leave Mass**. This will prevent the need to pass the collection bags from person to person and, hopefully, reduce the possibility of spreading infection. In addition, we ask that you **take your newsletter home with you, do not leave it in the seat**. As well, **after each Mass please place the hymn sheet in the container in the porch**. There will be sufficient sheets provided for every Mass, and this will prevent anyone having to use a sheet handled by someone else. Don't forget the advice we have



been given: that of good personal hygiene, particularly to wash our hands, and as well to follow the advice on the posters, if you blow your nose or sneeze, **'catch it, bin it, kill it'**. Let us keep in our prayers those with the virus, and those helping to care for them.
