for quiet prayer and contemplation.

While it is no surprise that the Bishops of England and Wales have decided public liturgies should cease from, last, Friday evening 20<sup>th</sup> March, it is nonetheless very sad. Because of the situation that the Church finds herself in, the obligation of the faithful to attend Holy Mass on a Sunday or Holy day of Obligation is removed, until further notice.

The Cardinal writes in today's pastoral letter: "You need no words from me to state the grave seriousness of the crisis of the spread of the coronavirus around the world and throughout this country. We know the steps and the sacrifices we must take in order to play our part in slowing its spread, saving lives and enabling the NHS to continue its vital work. These things are our duty before God".

We hope to continue to produce a parish newsletter each week, which will be available in church, on the parish website: [parish.rcdow.org.uk/harpenden](http://parish.rcdow.org.uk/harpenden), or can be sent electronically if you provide your email address to the Parish Office. Also please keep an eye on the Parish Website for updates and news. Maintaining communication with each other is very important, and we are also looking at other ways to do this.

The Parish Office will be closed, but the Administrator will continue to be available during office hours, by telephone or email, as will Canon Dwyer.

These worrying days are a time for prayer. Turn to the Lord in prayer. Trust that the Lord hears you and is with you. God will never abandon his people. He is with us, as He was with His Son in the darkest hours.

## **CHURCH OF THE HOME**

Although the obligation to attend Mass has been lifted, for the time being, it is a good practise to keep Sunday special. That might be done by praying as a family at home, or reading the scriptures for the day, see <http://wednesdayword.org/sunday-gospel.htm> or by making a visit to the church.

While public Masses will not be celebrated, the church will still be open each day: Monday to Saturday 9.30am to 6.00pm, and Sunday 8.00am to 6.00pm.

## **KEEPING LENT 2020**

As the Coronavirus occupies our thoughts and prayers, it may be hard to observe this season of Lent. The worry and concern we experience will surely add to the nature of this penitential season. While it may not be possible to continue some Lenten Activities, such as the Lent Groups, it is nonetheless important that we try and observe the spirit of Lent in some way. Although we may not make the Stations of the Cross as a community, we can still follow them on our own. The church will continue to be open, and so there is the opportunity to visit for quiet prayer.

## **LIGHT A CANDLE**

Presidents of Churches Together in England, including Cardinal Nichols, have issued a call to prayer in the light of the Coronavirus pandemic. This is for all churches and people of prayer to join on Sunday 22nd March, Mothering Sunday. They write:

This Mothering Sunday, 22nd March, we are calling all churches to a National Day of Prayer and Action. At such a time as this, when so many are fearful and there is great uncertainty, we are reminded of our dependence on our loving Heavenly Father and the future that he holds. At 7pm this Sunday, light a candle in the windows of your homes as a visible symbol of the light of life, Jesus Christ, our source and hope in prayer.

## **PRAYING TOGETHER**

In times such as this, it is important that we 'pray without ceasing'. Each of us will pray in our own ways, at whatever time suits us. Although we cannot, physically, come together to pray we could try to pray at the same time wherever we are. We can have one voice in praying for ourselves and our country, and all who are affected by Coronavirus.
