These days between the Ascension of the Lord and the great feast of Pentecost are strange days. Strange days, days of waiting, days when we are conscious of our powerlessness. From time to time, we all get experiences of our own powerlessness and weakness. A sudden illness, or perhaps a brush with death, and we come face to face with our own powerlessness. And simple things too such as waiting in a queue, not an unfamiliar experience at the moment, or waiting in a traffic jam, remind us of our powerlessness, there is simply nothing we can do. And indeed, at this time, in the face of the Coronavirus, we can feel quite powerless, quite helpless, what can we do? It is often only in weakness that we realise our need of the Spirit.

Nine days separate the feast of the Ascension from the feast of Pentecost. During those nine days the apostles, with Mary in their midst, assembled in the upper room and made an intense novena of prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit. This then is the oldest and most important novena in the Church. Unfortunately, it is also the most neglected. This is a great pity, for each Pentecost renews the gift of the Holy Spirit in the Church.

In whatever way we can we must keep these days as days of prayer. It's not as if we have never received the Spirit. We have, many times, especially at Baptism and Confirmation. But these precious days will help to deepen our consciousness of our need of the Holy Spirit and increase our longing to receive him more completely. Pentecost then will renew his gift in us and in the Church.

## STILL OPEN

Our church, sadly locked, like so many others is upsetting, but Mass is still celebrated there, and the life of the parish continues in, albeit, different ways. Some groups are meeting virtually, and others are giving support to some of those who are confined to their homes. Canon Dwyer continues to be available to parishioners, via telephone or email, or to meet virtually, and is happy to be in contact with anyone who wishes to be in touch.

## PENTECOST MESSAGE

The Cardinal has recorded a video of a pastoral message in preparation for Pentecost. In it, he reflects on the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, particularly in the context of the circumstances in which we are living at the moment. He also writes: 'As we approach Pentecost, let's have a fervent, focused prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit afresh within us, in our families, our parishes, and in this family of this diocese as a whole. I hope that, on Saturday evening next, the Vigil of Pentecost, you will choose to spend a bit of time in prayer. Please pray for me.

And we say very simply: 'Come Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen.'

### BRIGHT SKY DOMESTIC ABUSE APP



## SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

In the present circumstances, we cannot receive Holy Communion but we can make a Spiritual Communion. Set aside some time either alone, or better with your family. Turn off the tv or radio.



Firstly: Make the sign of the Cross.

Then: Make an act of Contrition.

Then say: *My Jesus, I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though You have already come, I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.*

Finish by making the Sign of The Cross


