The Good Shepherd

On this fourth Sunday of Easter we hear Jesus portraying himself as a shepherd. And what is the duty of this shepherd? To protect his flock, to lead the flock, to know the flock. There is a beautiful line in this passage which reads: 'the sheep follow him because they know his voice.' What does it mean, to know the voice of Jesus? It is to be in deep relationship with Him, to know His voice above the 'noise' of the world around us. In order to know someone, we have to spend time with them, being aware of their presence, talking to them, listening, considering them friend and beloved.

So, today's Gospel invites us into a deep relationship with the Shepherd; invites us to listen out for his voice, a voice that brings peace, not discomfort. As we ponder this Gospel reading so we are caught up in the worry of the Coronavirus outbreak. With social distancing, schools and colleges closed, it is a frightening time for many people. As Christ is shepherd to us, so we are also called to be shepherds to others. To check in on neighbours, or those who might be vulnerable; to help those who might be hungry, through supporting a local foodbank; to telephone someone, living alone, who is self-isolating.

Despite the worry of Coronavirus, and the restrictions we are living with, there are signs of goodness to be seen. Signs of goodness as we witness how many are ready to shepherd, to care for, others. The qualities of the Good Shepherd we can express, not just in times of crisis, but in all times so that all may 'have life and have it abundantly.'

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

Today we are asked to pray for our seminarians and encourage other men to consider the call to the priesthood. The seminaries, Allen Hall, the Venerable English College and the Beda College in Rome, where future Westminster priests are in formation, are physically closed. Nevertheless, prayer continues in the life of seminarians and staff, and they are able to participate in streamed liturgies. All have on-line lectures, regular conversations with formation staff and spiritual direction. Our seminarians are praying for an end to the pandemic, for the priests serving in the parishes and hospitals, the heroic healthcare staff and care workers, and all who are suffering from this virus. While the present reality lacks the community dimension of formation and the important common liturgical life, their studies and preparation for priesthood continue. Due to the pandemic, as we are unable to gather in our churches to celebrate Mass, this year there will not be a collection for the Priests' Training Fund. May they model through their actions and words the example of Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd, who came to serve and not to be served.



SUPPORTING EACH OTHER

Many people have had a call already, if you haven't, or know of someone who hasn't, it may be because we haven't got up to date contact details for you, or perhaps you haven't completed a new parishioner form. Although we can't be together, we still share the same faith, and belong to the same parish, this is one way in which we express those realities.



LET US PRAY

Prayer is at the heart of everything that we do and, at times such as this, it is important that we 'pray without ceasing'. Each of us will pray in our own ways, at whatever time suits us. Although we cannot, physically, come together to pray we could try to pray at the same time each day wherever we are, and so, as a parish, be united in prayer. **So, each evening**

at 7.30pm it would be good if everyone in the parish could pause to pray, maybe to use a prayer that all the family knows, or perhaps a decade, or more, of the Rosary. In that way we can be united in a prayer for ourselves

and our country, and all who are affected by Coronavirus.



MARY'S MONTH

May is traditionally the month of Mary, a time when we, particularly, remember and honour the mother of God, and our Mother too. If it's not a regular practice for you, it's a good time to pray the Rosary, or another prayer to Mary, either individually, or as a family. SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

In the present circumstances, we cannot receive Holy Communion but we can make a Spiritual Communion.

Set aside some time either alone, or better with your family. Turn off the tv or radio.

Firstly: Make the sign of the Cross.

Then: Make an act of Contrition.

Then say: *My Jesus, I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul. Since I*

cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least

spiritually into my heart. As though

You have already come, I embrace

You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Finish by making the Sign of The Cross
