### CELEBRATING MASS

For the first time in 15 weeks some of us are able to celebrate Mass together, and that is a great joy. I know how much many of you have missed being able to fully share in the celebration of the Eucharist, even if it was somewhat more comfortable watching from your own home! This weekend, and next, there will be just one Mass at 10.30am, but I hope that that will increase. While it's good that we can resume the celebration of Mass, we are not getting back to normal. You will see that the celebration of Mass is slightly different, we have been given permission to omit certain things, so that the time you are in church is less than usual. When you arrive at church, we will check that you have let us know you would be attending. There is a 'one-way' system in operation in church, arrangements for receiving Holy Communion, and leaving the church are different, and the toilet is not available. There will be stewards to guide you, we ask your cooperation, and your patience.

In order to fulfil the regulations from the Government and the Diocese, and to try and keep everyone safe in church, we need volunteers to supervise at Mass, and to clean the church after every Mass. Thank you to everyone who has already volunteered. More volunteers are needed, if there are to be more Masses, it is up to you.

**If you want to attend Mass next Sunday**, for up to two people, you can inform us/book a seat via the parish website. More details on this can be found on page 2.

Everything is so different at the moment, including when you come to Mass. There is not a lot we can do about it; so, I do ask your patience and cooperation with what is happening, it is in everyone's interest.

## ATTENDING MASS NEXT SUNDAY

If you want to attend Mass next Sunday, for up to two people, you can inform us/book a seat via the parish website. You will be asked for your name, contact details and number of tickets you want to book. Booking will be open from today 5<sup>th</sup> July and will close at 12 noon on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> July to allow time for seats to be allocated. If you need places for three or more people then please email, or telephone the parish office, and we will let you know if there is room, or not. **During this coming week Masses will also be celebrated on Tuesday and Thursday at 9.15am, which you can attend if you let us know by email or telephone.** Now that regular Mass is resuming, the church will only be open, for limited periods, around the Mass times.

## PARISH LIFE CONTINUES

How good it is that our churches are open again, albeit for short periods, and of course for some to be able to attend Mass. The life of the parish continues in, albeit, different ways. Some groups are meeting virtually, and others are giving support to some of those who are confined to their homes. 
Catholic Mass is celebrated there every week. There is no other example of this anywhere in the UK. It has taken place ever since 1983.



## SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

In the present circumstances, we cannot receive Holy Communion but we can make a **Spiritual Communion**. Set aside some time either alone, or better with your family. Turn off the tv or radio.

Firstly: **Make the sign of the Cross.**

Then: **Make an act of Contrition.**

Then say: *My Jesus, I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul. Since I cannot now receive You*

*sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though You have already come, I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.*

Finish by making the **Sign of The Cross**
