Listening to today's parable it might be said that it is intended to bring comfort to everyone who does the minimum, those who arrive at the last minute.

In Jesus' time, if an employer needed some workers, he would go to the marketplace, look at those on offer, and select the most promising. Therefore, by the eleventh hour, what was left? Only the most unemployable. The idea that any employer would come along and take these people on, and to pay them the same wages as the others, was unthinkable. We can understand why those who had worked all day long objected so strongly when the eleventh-hour people were treated as equals.

But as heard in the first reading: 'my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts'. Jesus is making the point that God is generous. His generosity is extended to everybody, even to sinners and Gentiles. We must not limit God. We must not imagine that he is small minded like ourselves. 'My thoughts are not your thoughts, my ways are not your ways', says God.

God does not work on the merit system. A good thing too! Which of us would be happy that God would treat us according to what we have earned or according to strict justice? The truth is, to a greater or lesser degree, we are all eleventh-hour workers. Therefore, we all stand to benefit from God's extraordinary goodness.

It is not the length of the service we have given that matters but the amount of love we have shown. What matters is the spirit we bring to it. Our main concern must not be rewards, but simply the joy of serving God.

MASSES

It is good that this week the number of Masses celebrated increases. Mass times are now: Saturday, the Vigil Mass at 5.00pm, and on Sundays at 9.00am and 10.30am. On weekdays Masses are celebrated on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday at 9.15am. The issue we have is that every time the church is open, and after every Mass, the pews, and other parts of the church have to be sanitised. If more of you would volunteer to help, that would be so helpful, please contact the parish office with your name and telephone number. Please be reassured that social distancing is strictly observed, that face masks must be worn and that the distribution of Holy Communion is carefully organised.
