On this first Sunday of Lent, we are invited to embrace the wilderness. The past year has given us experience of wilderness as our world battled a pandemic. Many people were afraid, isolated, alone, and uncertain of what the future would bring. Humanity was adrift in what seemed like a desert moment. However, wilderness can bring opportunity. It can be a time for deep reflection, where we take stock of what is most important to us, a chance to let go of things that are really not important and focus on where we are being called to be

Lent is also a time where people give up something, focus on weight loss or getting fit, take on a course, try to better themselves in some way. And these can be good things, but Lent is so much more than that. It is a retreat time, a time to make room for something deeper. It is a spring-cleaning sort of time, an opportunity to ask, 'what needs clearing out in my life so that I can make more room for God?' 'What changes am I being called to embrace?' Without change we cannot grow, and things fast become stale in our lives. God is always urging us on because God knows just what possibilities there are for each of us. Lent offers us the opportunity to make space for something new, to let go of that which is keeping us from living life to the full.

The Gospel today is short, Jesus is sent into the wilderness, into the desert, and we too are invited into a desert time. Deserts give us space to reflect. Let us try to embrace this wilderness. How we make use of this time determines what will be.

TAKING THE OPPORTUNITY

Lent, we can say, is a time of opportunity. A time of opportunity when, having reflected on our lives, we can think about what else we need to do if we are to draw closer to the Lord, and so be ready to celebrate the great feast of Easter. In the parish there will be the Lent Groups, and, virtual, Stations of the Cross, or you might consider attending a weekday Mass. All good ways to observe Lent. But there are other things you might think about, such as making time to call a lonely person, finding extra time for prayer, or reading a spiritual book or some of the Bible. What is important in Lent is that we do something, that we don't allow this God-given opportunity to slip by, unmarked in some way.


- Please note that there is no Mass at 9.15am on Thursday.

CONTACTLESS

Although it is not particularly comfortable to talk about, the parish is dependent on parishioners for financial support which, enables the life of the parish to continue.

We are very fortunate to have so many parishioners, who have continued to give their support since the first lockdown last March. That said I am also aware that, for some, because of changes in circumstances, caused by the pandemic, it is not possible to give support at this time, and that is perfectly understandable. Many parishioners give their support by envelope, and others by standing order, all of which is much appreciated.

We now have two further ways in which you can give your support. As you will have seen, contributions can be made via '**Virgin Money Giving**', please use the QR code at the top of the newsletter.



Also, along with a number of other parishes in the Diocese, we have been asked to participate in a trial for '**contactless**' giving. A contactless giving point is now located in the Church porch. To make an offering using contactless giving, select the amount you wish to donate and tap the top of the machine with your phone or card.



TOGETHER IN PRAYER

Although only a comparatively small proportion, of the parish, can attend one of the six Masses celebrated each week, we can still be united, in prayer. While the threat of the Coronavirus continues, we can continue to pray for everyone who is affected by it. And we might think of doing that each evening, at 7.30pm. Just pausing, either individually, or as a family, and offering a prayer for everyone who is affected, in any way by Coronavirus, and to pray for everyone in our parish also. Every Tuesday, starting this week, we will resume praying together via Zoom. For the code see below. This will be for a short time, not more than ten minutes.

ST DOMINIC NURSERY



The application process for Nursery places is now open for children born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018. Our Early Years provision enables parents to access 30 hours free childcare with Nursery morning sessions running Monday - Friday, 8.45-

11.45am and an optional Lunch Club and afternoon Pre-School run by *Friends Together* running until 3.30pm. Wrap around care offered by *Friends Together* also means that care for children is available between 7.50am and 6pm, should this be required.

NURSERY REFERENCES

Parents who need the Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP) completed, are asked to drop the form through the presbytery letterbox, **enclosing a stamped**

addressed envelope. Canon Dwyer will complete the forms, as appropriate, and, will as necessary, make contact by telephone or virtually. A copy of the CCP can be provided but, for it to be completed, parents will need to provide the full name, address and date of birth of the child. The closing date for applications is March 1st.


