The reading for the blessing of palms captures the elation of the crowds who welcome Jesus in Jerusalem, singing 'Hosanna! Blessings on him who comes in the name of the Lord!' But their hope and loyalty is short-lived. Jesus is left almost alone to face humiliation and death. His followers have heard his radical message of reversal and upheaval, but when it comes down to it, the challenge is too much. We are told 'they all deserted him and ran away'. While Peter follows Jesus at a distance, he is soon denying he even knows him. Soon, the crowds are shouting for Jesus to be crucified.

We are very familiar with the Passion Gospel and it can be tempting to allow ourselves to tune out, particularly when it comes to the unpleasant parts. We do not like to think of ourselves as part of the mob shouting 'Crucify him!' Yet if we enter fully into the experience, we can see ourselves in the story. When things are going well, it is easy to praise God and shout 'Hosanna!', and promise we will not lose faith. There are days when we struggle, when we are confused, or do not know what God expects of us, or whether we are able to handle the difficult times. We pull away from God. The different disciples display this range of human reactions and emotions. This week, Holy Week, we are the disciples walking with Jesus on a journey that leads to the cross. Here at the cross, we find Mary Magdalene and the other female disciples, and Joseph of Arimathaea. We know the story is not over for these disciples, or for Peter and the others. As for them, so for us, the journey of discipleship continues.

### When you come to Mass:

Please follow the guidance of the stewards,  
wear a mask, sanitise your hands when entering and leaving,

**do not mingle with anyone outside of your household or support bubble.**

**If you suspect you may have Coronavirus symptoms, have been in touch with anyone who has, or if you are feeling unwell, do not come to church.**

If you wish to attend the celebrations on Palm Sunday 12.00 Noon, or Maundy Thursday, you must request a place in advance. Up to 2 places can be reserved via the Parish website, for three or more places, please email the parish office.

All other Liturgies during Holy Week and Easter are now fully booked.

### A LITTLE DIFFERENT

The Bishops of England and Wales, in line with guidance, received from the Congregation in Rome, have issued guidance on the Holy Week services. Inevitably these will be different due to Covid restrictions. For example, we are unable to have our normal processions, the washing of the feet, individual veneration of the cross, votive candles or communal singing.

### WE NEED TO KNOW

Don't forget that if you are hoping to attend any of the main Holy Week liturgies, you need to check first that there is a place available. If, for whatever reason, you have been allocated a place, but find you are unable to use it, please notify the parish office. A large number of parishioners have indicated they

wish to attend the various celebrations, and it would be a great shame, if places, that were requested, were to go unused.

### ALTAR OF REPOSE

On Maundy Thursday, the tradition is that, after the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Blessed Sacrament is taken, in procession, to the Altar of Repose, where the people can gather to pray, until late in the evening. This year, like other parishes, we can have neither the procession, nor the Altar of Repose. There will, however, be an Altar of Repose in the parish of Maiden Lane. Everyone in the diocese is invited to join in prayer, paying a virtual visit to the Diocesan Shrine of the Blessed Sacrament at Corpus Christi, Maiden Lane:
