The Gospel presents a dramatic scene where Jesus shows himself as Lord of the Temple. It's a scene where Jesus seems to be acting out of character, as Jesus with a small whip of cords physically drives out those trading in cattle, sheep and pigeons - animals to be used in sacrifices; as well as the moneychangers.

Jesus objected not to the trade as such, which was quite legitimate, but to its being done in the temple precincts, "my Father's house". "Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market." Such business should have been carried on just outside the temple precincts but we know that in our own time dealers try to get as close to the action as possible, especially if they have competition. It is also not at all impossible that the temple authorities connived at the practice and, may have even benefited, if the traders had to "rent" spaces in the Temple to do their business.

This would explain the priests' anger at what Jesus was doing. "What's going on here? What sign can you show to justify what you are doing?" Jesus replies: "Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up." They come back: "It has taken 46 years to build this temple and you can raise it in only three days?" This was indeed true and, in fact, the building had not yet been fully completed at this time.

But Jesus was speaking about another sanctuary, another temple where God lived - his own body. Through this event we are reminded during Lent of what we are preparing to remember and celebrate - the death and resurrection of Jesus.

### **ATTENDING MASS**

Although the obligation to attend Mass is still suspended, it is good to see that a reasonable number choose to attend Mass. Each weekend three Masses are celebrated, and there is room for more. Those who do attend often comment how safe they feel in church, safer, they say than in the supermarkets. There are stewards at every Mass, and the church is sanitised after every event that takes place. If you haven't attended for a while, you might think about doing so.

### **SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION**

The present guidelines make it difficult to have a regular time for Confessions. Canon Dwyer is happy to hear confessions, for anyone who would like to do so. ### **FROM THE POPE**

Pope Francis in his [General Audience of 26 February 2020](#), affirmed, "Lent is a favourable time to make room for the Word of God. It is the time to switch off the television and open the Bible. It is the time to separate from mobile phones and connect to the Gospel". He explained, "When I was a child there was no television but there was the habit of not listening to the radio". Lent is a desert. It is a time to give up something, to distance ourselves from mobiles and connect to the Gospel. It is the time to give up useless words, gossip and slander and to talk to and be informal with the Lord. It is the time to dedicate ourselves to a healthy ecology of the heart, to cleanse it."

It continues to receive numerous, hugely worthwhile project proposals to improve the life of some of the most disadvantaged communities in the world, in a sustainable way. However, its income is well below 'normal' levels as it remains practically impossible to hold fundraising events and because of the fall in collections at church due to the limits on congregation size.
