Jesus is risen, present in every person in some way, present in a special way in his own disciples, that is, those who accept him as their Lord. Today's Gospel says that our relationship to him is similar to a tree and its branches. The branch cannot be separated from the parent tree and continue to live. Is that why many, with the name of Christian, fall away? They have never really been part of the vine?

At the same time, it is not enough to be a branch on the tree. There must also be fruit produced. It is not enough to be a Christian and "fulfil one's religious duties". What is that fruit that Jesus speaks of? We get an indication from the First Letter of John. There he says that love cannot just be in words and talk, not even in the most lovely-sounding prayers. Love, he says, is shown in action, in deeds. Only when we are loving in deed can we know that Jesus lives in us.

We have an example of this in the experience of St Paul in today's First Reading. He said that he was now a disciple of Jesus and no longer a persecutor of Christians. They didn't believe him. They felt he was an infiltrator. The leopard does not change his spots. His words were not enough. When his new-found Christian faith bore fruit, when his love was shown in action, then they knew that Jesus was his Lord.

So, we can ask ourselves: Am I really a living branch on the vine that is Jesus? Am I really a Christian that bears fruit? Am I living my life creatively so that others also benefit?

CELEBRATING MASS TOGETHER

The Bishop's of England and Wales have been reflecting about the need to celebrate Mass together, included in their reflection:

"It is the Eucharist, the celebration of the Mass, that makes the Church; and it is the Church, in the gift of the Holy Spirit, which makes the Eucharist. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the lifeblood of the Church. It requires our active participation and, to be fully celebrated, our physical presence.

"At this moment, then, we need to have in our sights the need to restore to its rightful centrality in our lives the Sunday Mass, encouraging each to take his or her place once again in the assembly of our brothers and sisters.

"We face the task of seeking to nurture the sense of Sunday as 'a weekly gift from God to his people', and something we cannot do without; to see Sunday as the soul of the week, as giving light and meaning to all the responsibilities we live out each day; to see the Sunday Eucharist as food for the unique mission with which we have been endowed."


PARISH NEWSLETTER
