Today's Gospel is often referred to as the 'Great Commission'. It contains the instructions of the Risen Jesus to the disciples to spread the Good News to the ends of the earth, to teach and to baptise 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'. As we celebrate Trinity Sunday today, we pay attention in particular to the very last words of Matthew's Gospel: 'And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.' Jesus will be with his followers through the gift of the Holy Spirit, God's presence with us.

We read that some of the disciples were hesitant when they encountered Jesus on the mountain. They had lost him to death, and now he was risen and with them again in the flesh. They may have felt they weren't ready or able for the task he was handing over to them. These first disciples were an imperfect group of people, yet Jesus chose them to spread God's vision of love, compassion and justice throughout the world. Jesus chooses us also. He chooses us to carry out the task of living, and sharing, his vision of love. Perhaps, like some of the disciples, we are fearful or doubtful. At a time when everything is changing so rapidly, and life seems to be so uncertain, it can be difficult to navigate our own faith journey, never mind communicate it to others. Yet we have Jesus' assurance that he is with us, with the love and strength we need. The Holy Spirit is at work, inspiring and guiding us, shaping our lives, helping us to make the love of God present to all we meet.

## TOWARDS NORMALITY.....

The Bishops of England and Wales have issued further guidance in the light of the changes to the current lockdown restrictions. Those entering the church, for Mass will still need to observe the expected social distancing and wear a face mask. You will also be asked to sanitise your hands on entering and leaving the building. Those attending Mass on Saturday or Sunday, should continue to request a place via the website, or by email. We would ask, if at all possible, that people use their mobile phone and the QR code provided to register via NHS Test and Trace.

### So from this weekend:

- The distribution of Holy Communion will return to its usual place in the Mass. Instead of coming forward to receive, you should remain in your places, and the celebrant, and extraordinary Minister, will move through the empty pews, giving Holy Communion.
- Instead of saying a collective 'Amen' to 'Body of Christ', we will return to the practise of saying 'Amen' individually when receiving Holy Communion.
- After you have received, please remain in your place, and Mass will conclude in the usual way.
- Following the Blessing, please remain in your places, until the stewards direct you safely from the church.

**From next weekend the second reading and the intercessions will be reinstated.**
