Today we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, a feast that speaks to us of the wonderful gift that we receive in Holy Communion - the gift of Jesus himself - his body and blood. Freely and generously, Jesus gives himself to us, an undeserved, and unearned, gift. Sometimes, what we freely receive, what we don't have to work for, we may not appreciate as much as those things we have to put effort into achieving.

For the past fifteen months there have been those two periods when it has not been possible to celebrate Mass with a congregation and, since public Masses have been permitted, some parishioners, for health reasons, have been unable to, physically, attend Mass. Not attending Mass, and being unable to receive Holy Communion, has, I know, been hard for many of you.

Although it has been hard not celebrating together, could it be a moment of opportunity also? A moment when the 'absence' helps us to appreciate, even more, what we are not receiving, and creates an even greater desire within us for the gift of the Eucharist.

It has been good in recent weeks to see an increase in the numbers attending Mass, but there is still room for more; less than 20% of parishioners are presently attending. It would be good to see more young families attending, particularly those whose children made their First Holy Communion last year, as well as those preparing for the Sacrament in the autumn.

As we celebrate this feast may we reflect anew on the wonderful gift that we have been given, and may we be renewed in both our appreciation of, and our desire for, this gift of Jesus himself; as we remember that when we gather together, we are truly the Body of Christ.

## TOWARDS NORMALITY.....

The Bishops of England and Wales have issued further guidance in the light of the changes to the current lockdown restrictions. Those entering the church, for Mass will still need to observe the expected social distancing and wear a face mask. You will also be asked to sanitise your hands on entering and leaving the building. Those attending Mass on Saturday or Sunday, should continue to request a place via the website, or by email. We would ask, if at all possible, that people use their mobile phone and the QR code provided to register via NHS Test and Trace.

### So from this weekend:

- The distribution of Holy Communion will return to its usual place in the Mass. Instead of coming forward to receive, you should remain in your places, and the celebrant, and extraordinary Minister, will move through the empty pews, giving Holy Communion.
- Instead of saying a collective 'Amen' to 'Body of Christ', we will return to the practise of saying 'Amen' individually when receiving Holy Communion.
- After you have received, please remain in your place, and Mass will conclude in the usual way.
- Following the Blessing, please remain in your places, until the stewards direct you safely from the church.

From this weekend the Intercessions will be reinstated.

So, a big 'thank you' to everyone, for your patience in cooperating with all the guidance.

Thank you very much to all those who give their time to steward at Mass, and to clean the church. Without you we would not be able to continue to celebrate Mass as frequently as we do. As people return to work, and take the opportunity to be away, our numbers are dropping a little, particularly on weekdays. If you have an hour, or so, to spare, during the week, or at weekends, it would be a great help if you could volunteer to be a steward. If you could help in this way please let the parish office have your details.



## LET US KNOW

It's good to see that, slowly, the numbers attending Mass are increasing. In recent weeks we have been unable to accommodate everyone who wishes to attend Mass. So, it's quite disappointing to see that quite a number, who request a place, don't always take them up, or let us know. If you are unable to use the place/s you have requested, please let us know by 3pm on Thursdays. It does matter because you could be depriving someone else of the opportunity to attend Mass.

The children preparing for First Communion, later in the year, will shortly be making their First Reconciliation. In preparation for this, there will be a **parent's meeting on Zoom, tomorrow Monday, at 7.30pm**. Parents should have received the meeting link by now.
