As you will be aware tomorrow, is an important day, when restrictions, imposed as a result of the pandemic, are to be lifted. The Bishops of England and Wales, have written saying:

"It is important to reiterate that as Step 4 is reached, the general principles of continuing to create a safe environment in places of worship and their ancillary buildings are not abandoned. Indeed, the way forward must be a collective endeavour of all involved in the daily life of the Church in England and Wales. Recognition of the presence of the virus in the population means that certain preventative practices will still be required, and this is important to ensure that it is seen that our Health and Safety duties are being discharged."

The Bishop's advise:

"Churches should continue to provide hand sanitiser at entrances and exits and face coverings are strongly recommended to be worn by those in church. General cleaning to a good standard is the level to continue. This is consistent with the advice from Public Health England. These are key actions which churches and parishes have been doing, and should continue to do, even after 19th July which significantly reduce this risk. We will follow the advice of the Bishops by: Continuing to provide hand gel, as people arrive for Mass, and leave the church. Asking everyone attending Mass to continue to wear a mask, unless they are exempt. Cleaning the church after each Mass.

From next weekend, there will be no need to request, a place, in advance, for the Sunday Masses.

For the time being, the church will remain closed except for before, and after, Mass. After the summer holidays, this will be reviewed, and I hope that it will be possible to open the church during the day.

Until the summer holidays are over, we will continue with one Mass on Saturdays, and two on Sundays. In September we will, hopefully, return to our practice of having four Masses each weekend.

These are important steps, on the return to 'normality'. Throughout the pandemic, those attending Mass, have cooperated fully with the various guidelines, and that has been tremendously supportive and encouraging. As we enter this new phase, I know I can depend on your continued cooperation, which is in the interests of the safety, and well-being of us all.

FAMILY PRAYER RESOURCES FOR SUMMER -




CAFOD will be offering a prayer focus for each week of the summer holidays with some simple ideas, designed to help parents explore faith with their children, in solidarity with our global
