With holidays over for many, and schools reopening, we're all very much living in the hope of returning to some sort of normality. In the parish too we hope to continue to gradually move towards doing things in the ways we used to.

It is no longer necessary to request a place if you are coming to Mass, and we are no longer required to ensure social-distancing in the church. However, that does not mean that everything is as it used to be, we still have to be very careful, in both protecting ourselves, and other people too. To try and ensure that our church is a safe place, hand sanitiser will continue to be dispensed as you arrive at, and leave, the church. We are also asked to collect the names of those attending Mass. You can record your details, by using the NHS app, or by adding them to one of the lists in the porch. The church will continue to be cleaned after each Mass, thanks to our excellent stewards.

You will notice that the wider seats, in the centre of the church, no longer have signs, indicating where you can sit. If you are double-vaccinated, and are happy to sit in these seats, closer to other people, that is fine. If, however for health, or other reasons, you prefer to have some space around you, then please sit in the smaller seats on the side. The signs, indicating where to sit, will be left on the side seats. Please, only sit in the side seats, if you need to have some space around you.

In the coming weeks we will look at how the church can, safely, be reopened for some time, each day, as well considering a, near as possible, return to the previous Mass times, In the meantime let us enjoy these steps towards normality, and let do what we can to stay safe!

## **JOIN A COURSE RUN BY HARPENDEN LEARNING FOR LEISURE (HLFL)**

If you are interested in the world, keen to keep your brain active and want to participate in an activity with likeminded people then a HLFL course may be just what you are looking for.

HLFL is a not-for profit organisation run by local people. It runs courses on a wide range of topics. Each course comprises 10 weekly daytime sessions, each session lasting 1 ½ or 2 hours. No qualifications are required to attend; there is no homework and no exams. Fees are payable, but are set at a level to only cover costs. Our participants find their HLFL courses an affordable, friendly, informal and enjoyable experience. With many returning every year.

The courses are now run from the Function Room of the Plough and Harrow pub in Southdown. It is a spacious, well ventilated room with its own entrance. Ample parking is available at the Co-op car park nearby. There is a break for the schools' half term. In the event of a 'lockdown' most courses move to Zoom, but participants are offered a refund if this is not possible.
