'THE LORD'S HIDDEN COMING'

"We know that the coming of the Lord is threefold: the third coming is between the other two and it is not visible in the way they are. At his first coming the Lord was seen on earth and lived among men, who saw him and hated him. At his last coming All flesh shall see the salvation of our God, and They shall look on him whom they have pierced. In the



middle, the hidden coming, only the chosen see him, and they see him within themselves; and so, their souls are saved. The first coming was in flesh and weakness, the middle coming is in spirit and power, and the final coming will be in glory and majesty." **St Bernard of Clairvaux.**

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, the saints always have a deeper insight to help enter in whatever situation you and I may find ourselves in, just like the psalms that we find in the bible as well, that describe every human emotion and thought have the same effect which help us reflect. We are now entering into the time of Advents. The beginning of the Church's liturgical year which point to us that Christ will come again in the flesh and we will all see him. Maybe this time you and I live it like another thing that is done routinely every year. I.e. Christmas carols, shopping, mulled wine. big coats, things on sale, presents, Christmas cards and many more. We live this time as consumers of a holiday which ends on the same day it starts in a mentality of a society that moves on to the next thing without surprise. (In fact Christmas lasts a week after the day and ends on Epiphany.)

St Bernard says in this sermon that Christ came in the flesh to dwell with us, to come into our reality. That he will come again and that you and I are called to be ready, his judgment will consist to give us according to our deeds, not our good works which is where we get confused but out deeds, the main deed is 'have we loved him, when we were loving and serving the other and forgiving our enemies,' which can be even those close to us?

And finally, the hidden coming which is now in this time of Advent. Which is summed up by the words of Christ when he says: If anyone loves me, he will keep my words, and the Father will love him, and we shall come to him. (John 14:23)

Let us be ready to meet the Lord this advent. Amen.
