THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION

This Friday brothers and sisters we celebrate the Feast of

the Presentation of the Lord. Because of this feast we have kept the crib up. Because this feast reminds us that the Lord wants to have a meeting with us.



In the early Church in fact this feast was known by this name because it is the beginning of Christ meeting with his people and his presentation in the temple after 40 days from the Epiphany. He was presented to the High Priest but he was expected to appear and meet those who have faith, like Simeon and Anna. Many faithful people today long for an encounter with the Lord, but perhaps feel like there isn't an encounter found in the temple. Perhaps the worries and troubles of life do not allow us to meet the Lord in his Word, in the Sacraments, and this feast comes to remind us all that God is nearer than we think.

That many people in our family or friend groups will come to the light of Christ if we first are reminded that we are called to bear the light of faith which we all have received in Baptism.

Let us say like Simeon: my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel.' Luke 2:22-40 or let us rejoice like Anna that Christ is our saviour.
