CALL FOR PRAYER ON ANNIVERSARY OF INVASION OF UKRAINE



Saturday 24th February, marks the second anniversary of the invasion of Ukraine by Russia. It's a conflict that has slipped from the headlines somewhat, but the fighting remains intense and the suffering is great. Bishop Kenneth Nowakowski, Bishop of the Eparchy, or diocese, of the Holy Family of London has called for prayer at this time as well as support and a re-evaluation of how we are all called to be peacemakers in our society today

Bishop Nowakowski, who looks after the UK's Ukrainian Catholic Community, has raised the plight of Ukraine's people, but he also calls for prayer for the suffering of the Holy Land caught up in the conflict in Gaza. He emphasises that, although we live miles away from the conflict, during this Lenten time of fasting and alms-giving, the other main pillar of the season - prayer - is where our focus should lie. He says that "We can't help everybody throughout the world with our limited means, but surely we can pray. Pray for peace, pray for justice, pray for those who are alone. Pray for those who are suffering - especially for those who are suffering separation. We think of the families that have been torn apart because of the war in Ukraine, the tens of thousands of young women who have fled to the United Kingdom with their children while their husbands have had to remain behind to defend Ukraine."

Synodal Pathway – The next stage of our input into the Synodal Pathway is taking place. We have been invited at short notice to respond to our dean with answers to the questions:

Q.1 How do we witness as a Parish and proclaim our faith to:

- those who have never heard of Christ;
- those who have ceased walking with Christ;
- those with whom we worship Christ (who go to church)?

Q.2: How should we organise ourselves as a Parish to do this more effectively?

Q.3: What concrete steps/formation opportunities would help us begin to witness and proclaim our faith more effectively?

Q.4: What structures may need to change? How might we need to develop the way we are organised currently?

If you can discuss at home or with friends that would be even better! These issues our at the very heart of our desire for parish renewal so are of help to us as a parish and worth reflecting on ourselves outside of the synodal process,

Ask your MP to support the abortion time limit reduction amendment - Right to Life UK are asking us to contact our local MPs to ask them to support an amendment to reduce the abortion time limit from 24 weeks to 22 weeks. Research indicates that a significant number of babies born at 22 or 23 weeks can now survive outside the womb, leaving a contradiction in our abortion law. Please collect a postcard from the back of the church and post it to Gareth Thomas MP (Harrow West) or your local MP in support of this amendment!
