#### **CHRIST IS OUR PASSOVER**



Brothers and Sisters as we get closer to Easter we are invited to fully participate in these celebrations of our Faith. One thing that I explained in my talks on the Passover, and what the people did before celebrating this great feast, was to get rid of the leaven. Yeast or leaven

makes bread rise, but the people of Israel of the scriptures before passing over through the Red Sea, had to have unleavened bread because they had no time to bake and make it rise, they were in a haste. Even today they keep this practice as a way to be reminded that they need to be ready to pass when the Lord calls. Our Lord Jesus speaks also about leaven and to be aware of leaven which makes us rise and think we have no need for God's Passover. In other words Jesus invites us to avoid hypocrisy and be attentive to the work God can do in our lives *Mark 8:14-22*.

This year God invites us to get rid of the old leaven and bring in the new which is Christ himself. The Jewish people (And Jesus was Jewish) in their Passover celebration have this reminder "In every generation all individuals should regard themselves as if they personally had come out of Egypt as we read, 'you shall tell your child on that day: 'It is in commemoration of what God did for me when I came out of Egypt.' For the Holy One, ever to be blessed, redeemed

no t only our ancestors, but us along with them, as it is said: God led us out from there, so as to bring us into the land promised to our ancestors and give it to us." Haggadah and pascal seder rites.



As we get closer to these celebrations we are reminded that Christ died for us and promises us eternal life. This is not just a mere story, but its is the saving action of God who frees us from sin and death. When we celebrate this year let us be reminded of this Truth and receive the Hope it can give us in our life. **Amen.**
