ENDURING CALVARY

Passion Sunday, or Palm Sunday as many people commonly know it, marks the beginning of Holy Week when we commemorate the triumphant arrival of Christ into Jerusalem, just days before the crucifixion.

This year as we journey through Holy Week we keep in particular prayer the land of Christ's birth. The parish priest of the only



Catholic parish in Gaza explained how the rest of the population feels greatly disheartened, as there are no visible signs of peace or an end to violence and death. In an interview with SIR, an Italian Catholic news agency, Fr. Romanelli laments the terrible toll of the war, saying, "This conflict has already resulted in more than 32,000 deaths, 12,000 of which are children." The members of the parish have been taking refuge for months in the parish compound along with other displaced Christians, totalling about 600, who have lost everything in the bombings. "The situation continues to be extremely grave and worsens by the hour. Our Christians have faith and hope in the Essential, in Jesus Christ," according to Fr. Romanelli. "They have been enduring relentless Calvary for months," he adds.

We all have our crosses, our own personal Calvary. Let us place them before the Lord in this week to come.
