What is Lent about?



In the first paragraph of his first encyclical, Pope Benedict XVI wrote: "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea but the encounter with an event, *a person*, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction."

Being Christian is not about *me*! Being Christian is essentially about *a person* – and his name is *Jesus*. It has been this way since the beginning. When Jesus called his disciples, his invitation was "Follow *me*". When he taught them the truth, he explicitly said "*I* am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but by *me*". No other religious leader in history has intentionally placed the focus on himself. However, Jesus continually places himself at the centre of faith.

When we encounter this person, Jesus, our life changes. Peter, a simple fisherman, who was a master at reading nature and so was a successful fisherman, had his life changed because he encountered a person. He recognised his sinfulness, and changed. Mary Magdalen was a wounded soul possessed by demons, her life changed because she encountered a person. The lives of sinners, outcasts, the ignored, and the forgotten were all transformed because they encountered a person. For each of them "the encounter with an event, a person, gave life a new horizon and a decisive direction".

If Christianity is about Jesus, that means Lent is also about this Jesus. Lent is not simply about prayer, fasting and almsgiving — which of course are important as a means to help us focus on what we need to focus on, but the purpose of Lent is to use these as tools to get closer and have a close encounter with Jesus, and so have our lives changed, so that we have a new horizon and a decisive direction. Pope St Leo the Great wrote: "there still is required a daily renewal to repair the shortcomings of our mortal nature, and whatever degree of progress has been made there is no one who should not be more advanced."
