

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

19 JULY AND THE RELAXING OF COVID PRECAUTIONS AND RESTRICTIONS: We don't expect to hear what this will mean for us and how things will change at church until late this week. We will send out an e-alert as soon as possible with news as soon as we can. As the rules slowly change it brings us new freedoms and new challenges. The most important thing is to keep our churches open and safe spaces for the faithful to gather to worship, and this means constant vigilance. In using our churches please keep in mind:

- 1) RESPECT FOR ONE ANOTHER: We need to preserve PHYSICAL DISTANCING. Please follow the directions of the stewards, and give each other space coming into and leaving church.
- 2) RESPECT FOR THE BLESSED SACRAMENT: If you are able to come to the grace of Holy Communion remember the guidelines: Holy Communion is received silently in the hands, which should be extended as far as possible in front of you, and you should be holding nothing else in your hands, including for example face coverings or a rosary. You are respectfully asked <u>not</u> to wear your face covering when coming to Holy Communion, so that you may worthily consume the Blessed Sacrament. This is why the priest wears his face covering at this point, to maximise mutual safety.

These guidelines are not invented by your parish clergy - they come to us from the bishops and we are all asked to respect them, clergy and faithful alike.

AID TO THE CHURCH IN NEED: An appeal has been made for us to write to the Home Secretary. On 7th June Priti Patel stated in the House of Commons that she would meet Sir Edward Leigh MP and representatives of Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) to discuss granting asylum to Maira Shahbaz. Maira, 15, is a Christian girl in Pakistan receiving death threats because of a false apostasy accusation. Over a month on, Priti Patel has not offered a date yet. The abortion lobby, led by the UK's largest abortion provider, BPAS, has worked with Diana Johnson MP to bring forward an amendment to hijack the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill to introduce abortion on demand, for any reason, up to birth to England and Wales.

This would be the single biggest change to abortion legislation since 1967 and would leave England and Wales with one of the most extreme abortion laws in the world. We are expecting that this radical proposal will be voted on by MPs this Monday.

GRANT MONEY AVAILABLE FOR GREENER HOMES: Maybe you have already heard of the scheme, but in brief, it offers grants of up to £10,000 to owner occupiers (and in some cases have been able to offer much more using additional schemes such as ECO) to carry out energy efficiency works on their properties at absolutely no cost to the resident. The West London Green Homes Grant: Local Authority Delivery Scheme is open to landlords and homeowners of D, E, F, and G rated homes in Barnet, Brent, Ealing, Hammersmith & Fulham, Harrow, Hounslow, Kensington and Chelsea, Lambeth, Newham, Richmond, and Wandsworth. To be eligible, the total household income must be below £30k/year (and up to £20k in housing benefits).
