## Solemnity of All Saints

**CALLING ALL SINGERS!** As we start parish life again we will be building up the music as an important part of our worship, starting with reviving the choirs at 10am and 11am Sunday Masses. **PRIMARY SCHOOL TRANSFER REQUESTS FOR ENDORSEMENT:** Those who need to ask for a "Certificate of Catholic Practice" are asked to send an email to the Parish Address with the following information:

- Name of parents and full name of child.
- Date of birth of child.
- Residential Address
- Name of EACH school to which an application is being made.

As you will understand, following the normal criteria for issuing certificates, almost nobody would qualify. A modified process is being followed. After receipt of your email you will be contacted from the office.

**SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS:** *This year is moved to Sunday 31 October.* November begins, of course, with the celebration of *All Saints.* Because the calendar this year moves the celebration to Sunday, we keep it the same day that less happy people celebrate "Halloween". For families: prepare for how you might celebrate the day, and the vigil of the day, which is, of course, the *Eve of All Hallows (Saints),* now ever increasingly celebrated by the secular/pagan "Halloween". **CATHOLICS DON'T CELEBRATE "HALLOWEEN", THEY CELEBRATE THE SAINTS ON THE "EVE OF ALL HALLOWS":** "The Eve of All Hallows Day" on 31 October should be for us a time of preparation for the great Feast Day. Remember, the Halloween nonsense only exists BECAUSE the following day is a great Christian festival. It is increasingly important that Catholics DO NOT get involved in "Halloween" activities, which celebrate the opposite. It might seem like harmless fun, but anything that normalises evil suits the purposes of the devil very well. Put a candle and a holy picture in your window. Have a kids' party and dress up as your patron saints. Celebrate our faith. Don't aimlessly follow the herd, but *"Be in the world, not of the world"* to paraphrase the Gospels and St Paul, for "You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14).

**TUESDAY 2 NOVEMBER: THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL SOULS:** After *All Saints*, we pray together and offer Mass especially for the Faithful Departed, the Holy Souls on their way to the glory of God. Whilst a solemn day, it is also filled with hope and even joy in celebrating the promises of God. Let us remember how Our Lady at Fatima urges us to pray for the Holy Souls that they might be aided to come to God. These two days are well summed up in the phrase "We pray for them, until they pray for us!" Mass will be offered twice that day: at 10.00am at St Gabriel's and at 7.30pm at St Bernard's.

### NOVEMBER: MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day) on Thursday 2nd November will commence the month of prayer for the Holy Souls. You are invited to take an envelope from the back of church in which you can list your deceased family and friends and enclose the offering you wish to make for the offering of Mass. You can return this envelope to either the Parish Office, the Presbytery, or to one of the boxes kept by the altar during November. Lists of the deceased will be kept near the altar and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be offered for the repose of the souls of those contained within these lists throughout November.

Pope Francis has requested a "Church-wide listening process" to hear where we are at and to hear people's experiences of faith with all its joys and disappointments, and to look for ways of strengthening each other. We are told by diocesan authorities to expect guidance and resources soon about how to practically organize the Synod process at parish level. In the meantime, this matter will be in the Prayer of the Faithful this Sunday and please commit it to your personal prayers.

A CALL TO LISTEN AND WALK TOGETHER: SYNOD 2022-23: Pope Francis has announced a Synod for the whole people of God. As part of the preparation for the Synod, the Pope has called every diocese to enter into a time of preparation, listening and discernment. Our diocese has produced a simple document for you to read which will be available at Mass this Sunday. PLEASE DO READ IT and think about the questions. We will designate some time in November/December to listen to each other and grapple with these questions...More soon!

**BLESSING OF GRAVES, NORTHWOOD CEMETERY:** will take place on Saturday 13th November. It will start with a short act of worship at the war memorial at 2.00pm followed by the blessing of individual graves.

**UPDATE ON THE ASSISTED SUICIDE LEGISLATION:** On Friday, peers got the opportunity to debate Baroness Meacher's Assisted Dying Bill. There were some fantastic speeches, including from Baroness Hollins and Baroness Hooper. There was no division on the Bill – as is custom for Private Members' Bills – so it will now progress to Committee Stage, although the Government has given a clear steer that it will not be supporting the legislation. Thank you to all who helped oppose the Bill.
