MISSION APPEAL BY THE HOLY GHOST FATHERS (SPIRITANS) 10/11 SEPT: Cardinal Vincent has invited the Spiritans to make the Mission Appeal in our diocese this year, and they will come to preach and make an appeal at all Masses *at St Gabriel's* **NEXT** weekend of 10/11 September. The Spiritans work in some 60 countries today in education, health and development. At home their work is with many on the margins: refugees; those suffering from addictions and prisoners. Please pray for their work in preparation for this visit. The Mission Appeal will be made at St Bernard's at a later date. See posters in the foyer at St Gabriel's.

DIOCESAN DAY PILGRIMAGE TO WALSIMGHAM: 24 SEPTEMBER: The first Diocesan Pilgrimage since 2019 takes place on the Feast of Our Lady of Walsingham. Led by Cardinal Vincent the theme is "Mary Mother of Sorrows, Mother of Joy". For our troubled world in a year of turmoil, confusion and the continued war in Ukraine we bring our prayers and intentions to Our Lady of Walsingham.

The Day Pilgrimage includes Holy Mass, Praying the Rosary over the Holy Mile procession, and Benediction in the priory grounds. As is previous years we plan to take a coach. The cost is $\pounds 25$ a seat (plus a $\pounds 5$ levy to cover Shrine costs). To reserve a place please contact the Parish Office as soon as possible, so that we can know that there is enough interest to go ahead.

Whether you know Walsingham well or have never been, this is a great opportunity to join a great act of prayer and intercession with all of our diocese.

BISHOPS' STATEMENT ON SUNDAY & HOLY DAY OBLIGATION: The bishops of England and Wales have issued a new statement about the obligation of Sunday Mass for those who wish to be practising Catholics. The text is available in the foyer and on the parish and diocesan websites. In essence they say: *"We therefore believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply"*. The statement is called an "Invitation" for all to be putting Sunday and Holy Day worship in first place as of Pentecost Sunday. If you have any questions or queries about this please ask one of the clergy. Also available in the foyer is Fr James' digest of the previous statements by the bishops, called *"Sunday - It is our day."*

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION IN OUR PARISH: As we emerge from the Covid period to a new reality, so too our approach to preparation for the sacraments needs to change. We don't have an official line on this in our diocese as yet, but Cardinal Grech, Chair of the European Conference of Bishops, memorably said in 2020 that if after Covid the Church went back to doing what we did before it would be suicide!

There are some radical new ways of thinking on this unfolding in some parishes around the UK as we wait for the bishops to take a lead. We will be a little less radical.

As Parish Priest I ask families and candidates not to come with particular expectations or sense of entitlement to what should happen when: candidates should come to the sacraments when they are ready, and the first step to being ready is that habitual Sunday worship in line with the "Obligation" should be the *established* norm for the families of small children - and the children be part of this - or chosen personally by those of teenage years and above. After that, we can start to look at the base on which to build. If you have any questions or observations, contact Fr James. (March 2022)
