MONDAY 31ST: MASS OF REQUIEM FOR PATRICK CONWAY: 12 Noon. Precedes repatriation before his Funeral Mass in Ireland. Of your charity come to pray for his soul.

SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS: TUESDAY 1 NOVEMBER: is All Saints Day and, of course for us a *Holy Day of Obligation*. The times of Mass that day in the parish will be the usual for Holy Days: 10.00am at St Gabriel's and 7.30pm at St Bernard's.

CELEBRATE THE SAINTS, NOT "HALLOWEEN": "The Eve of All Hallows Day" on 31 October should be for us a time of preparation for the great Feast Day. It is increasingly important that Catholics DO NOT get involved in "Halloween" activities, which celebrate the opposite. It might seem like harmless fun, but anything that normalises evil suits the purposes of the devil very well. Put a candle and a holy picture in your window. Have a kids party and dress up as your patron saints. Celebrate our faith. Don't aimlessly follow the herd, but "Be in the world, not of the world" to paraphrase the Gospels and St Paul, for "You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14).

COMMEMORATION OF THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED: WEDNESDAY 2 NOVEMBER: Mass for All Souls' Day will be offered at 10.00am at St Gabriel's and 7.30pm at St Bernard's.

NOVEMBER: MONTH OF HOLY SOULS: The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day) on Wednesday 2 November will commence the month of prayer for the Holy Souls. You are invited to take an envelope from the back of church in which you can put a list of your deceased family and friends and enclose any offering you can make for the offering of Mass. You can return this envelope to either the parish office, the Presbytery, or to one of the boxes kept by the altar during November. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be offered throughout November for the repose of the souls of those so remembered.

BISHOPS' STATEMENT ON SUNDAY & HOLY DAY OBLIGATION: The bishops of England and Wales have issued a new statement about the obligation of Sunday Mass for those who wish to be practising Catholics. The text is available in the foyer and on the parish and diocesan websites. In essence they say: *"We therefore believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply"*. The statement is called an "Invitation" for all to be putting Sunday and Holy Day worship in first place as of Pentecost Sunday. If you have any questions or queries about this please ask one of the clergy. Also available in the foyer is Fr James' digest of the previous statements by the bishops, called *"Sunday - It is our day."*

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION IN OUR PARISH: As we emerge from the Covid period to a new reality, so too our approach to preparation for the sacraments needs to change. We don't have an official line on this in our diocese as yet, but Cardinal Grech, Chair of the European Conference of Bishops, memorably said in 2020 that if after Covid the Church went back to doing what we did before it would be suicide!

There are some radical new ways of thinking on this unfolding in some parishes around the UK as we wait for the bishops to take a lead. We will be a little less radical.

As Parish Priest I ask families and candidates not to come with particular expectations or sense of entitlement to what should happen when: candidates should come to the sacraments when they are ready, and the first step to being ready is that habitual Sunday worship in line with the "Obligation" should be the *established* norm for the families of small children - and the children be part of this - or chosen personally by those of teenage years and above. After that, we can start to look at the base on which to build. If you have any questions or observations, contact Fr James. (Notice issued March 2022)
