A HAPPY, BLESSED AND JOYFUL EASTER TO YOU ALL!

HOLY WEEK COLLECTIONS: Thank you also for your contributions to the Lenten Alms and Holy Places collections. We will publish totals for these in the coming weeks.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: The Second Sunday of Easter is now known throughout the Church as the Sunday of Divine Mercy, the title given by St John Paul II, not as his own idea, but responding to the request made of St Faustina by the Lord Jesus in mystery.

Essentially Our Blessed Saviour asks us to centre ourselves in a particular way on this Sunday in devotion to the power of his mercy - as a moment of grace to remind ourselves of what should be at the heart of our lives every day! It is a grace filled expression of the meaning of Easter and a way to touch sacramentally the Passion, death and Resurrection of the Lord.

We will offer the DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY DEVOTIONS at 2pm at St Bernard's, with a time of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and celebrating the "hour of mercy" with the 3pm prayers. Those wishing to make the Divine Mercy devotions should attend their Sunday Mass as normal and make use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the week before or after this Sunday.

MARY DUNNE RIP: Mary's Funeral Mass is on Thursday 20 April at 12Noon. Of your charity come to prayer for her soul if you are available on Thursday.

JOE (PHELIM) TUFFY RIP: Joe's Funeral Mass will be on Tuesday 25 April at 12 Noon at St Gabriel's.

CORONATION OF H.M. KING CHARLES: The Bishops' Conference asks each parish to offer Mass for God's grace for the King on 5 May. This will be the intention at the 10am mass that day, and particular prayers for Mass have been provided by the bishops. We pray indeed that our new king will always uphold all that is in accord with the truth of Catholic faith and the common good.

CORONATION OF H.M. KING CHARLES: PARISH LUNCH: To mark Coronation weekend we hope to have a Parish Lunch on Sunday 7 May. This will follow the established pattern, in St Gabriel's hall following the 12 Noon Mass, as a way to celebrate Easter together and also this significant national moment. Come along and bring something to share for lunch. *Coronation Chicken might be especially appropriate!*

PARISH ACCOUNTS FOR 2022: A summary of the Parish Accounts for 2022 is posted in the foyer of each church. From this you can see the following:

- Income is up, which is good news. BUT we are not giving to the parish in the most efficient way. Please consider giving by means of a Standing Order and, if you are a tax payer, making a Gift Aid declaration.
- The amount of Gift Aid we were able to claim in 2022 was roughly the same as in 2021. This means that several thousand pounds of FREE MONEY from the government went to waste.
- Expenditure is roughly in line with what we expect. Less repair and fabric work were done in 2022, so it looks as though we have a much bigger surplus. However, fabric work will need to be done, and of course fuel/energy costs are rising dramatically in 2023.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION IN OUR PARISH: As we emerge from the Covid period to a new reality, so too our approach to preparation for the sacraments needs to change. We don't have an official line on this in our diocese as yet, but Cardinal Grech, Chair of the European Conference of Bishops, memorably said in 2020 that if after Covid the Church went back to doing what we did before it would be suicide!

There are some radical new ways of thinking on this unfolding in some parishes around the UK as we wait for the bishops to take a lead. We will be a little less radical.

As Parish Priest I ask families and candidates not to come with particular expectations or sense of entitlement to what should happen when: candidates should come to the sacraments when they are ready, and the first step to being ready is that habitual Sunday worship in line with the "Obligation" should be the *established* norm for the families of small children - and the children be part of this - or chosen

personally by those of teenage years and above. After that, we can start to look at the base on which to build. If you have any questions or observations, contact Fr James. *(Notice issued March 2022)*
