

FR JAMES WRITES ABOUT THE FUTURE OF PRIESTLY MINISTRY TO OUR PARISH:

Last weekend Fr Carlos and I passed on to you an outline of the plan for providing priestly ministry to our parish in a stable and sustainable way for the next chapter of her life. Our particular circumstances of having two sites and the ever-changing pastoral challenges of the locality make this complex and urgent. Over the 12 years I have been here we have seen great upheavals. During that time we were blessed for some years to have stable regular help for the Sunday Mass schedule. Subsequently our arrangements have changed every year or two, which is not ideal.

In order now to try to provide for the spiritual needs of the parish, and *so that we can keep* the same pattern of Sunday Masses as we have now, the Archbishop has decided with his advisers to give care of the parish to priests of a Religious Congregation who will live as a stable community of priests, based at the Presbytery, and take charge of the parish from September this year. Fr Carlos and I will then move to new appointments in the diocese.

We'll say more about which Congregation and which priests will be coming to Harrow South and Northolt, and tell you what will be happening to Fr Carlos and myself, as soon as all is settled in the coming days and weeks.

Please keep this matter at the heart of your prayers in the coming weeks.

JEAN HUSSEY RIP: The Funeral Mass for Jean will be at St Gabriel's Church at 12 Noon on Monday 5 June. *May she rest in peace.*

MONDAY 5 JUNE: After the 10.00am Mass there will not be a time of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in order to prepare the church for the Funeral Mass.

SATURDAY MORNINGS IN JUNE: During June there are a number of diocesan events - Ordinations to the priesthood and diaconate - and meetings that mean I regret that it is not possible to schedule the normal Mass and devotions and time for Reconciliation. Keep an eye on the weekly schedule.

SUNDAY 11 JUNE CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION: Once again we will join with our brothers and sisters of the Polish Catholic Mission for a Procession of the Blessed Sacrament at St Bernard's. Timetable as follows: 3.00pm Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament; 3.55pm Benediction; 4pm Procession forms and makes its way "around the block" via Church Road, Ealing Road; Eastcote Lane and Mandeville Road back to Church WHERE THE Polish Mass will follow. We stop on the Green to hear the Gospel. This is a great act of witness, come along to pray and worship.

SYCAMORE: A COURSE IN EXPLORING CHRISTIAN FAITH: *How can we find happiness? What's the meaning of life? Is there a God?* These are questions that you or someone you know may be thinking about. *Sycamore* is an informal course about the Christian faith and its relevance for life today. It gives you space to meet other people, share ideas, explore your beliefs, and think about questions that really matter. It can form a real sense of community, a spirit of friendship, some great conversation. **NEXT MEETING will be at St. Gabriel's Church Hall on Monday 19 June at 7.00pm refreshments available!** All are welcome - whether a faithful parishioner of many years or someone who is starting his/her journey of faith. Meetings then will be every two weeks or so, giving five more up to the summer. Ask Fr Carlos for more information.

SATURDAY 1 JULY "GABRIEL DAY": Come and help to tidy up St Gabriel's site, do the weeding and look after the planting. Joan Gabriel (RIP) made this her special work, and the site is looking a bit neglected since her death. So in a change in the normal schedule, the 10.00am Mass on 1 July will be at St Gabriel's, and is offered for the souls of Joan and Freddie Gabriel. After Mass we will set to on all the work that needs doing. Bring a fork, or trowel, or hoe, or broom, gloves, knee pads etc. Many hands make light work. Refreshments will be available!

TUESDAY 4 JULY: SVP CONFERENCE MEETING: Good news! We now have solid progress in forming the SVP Conference and starting to do some pastoral work among the parish. SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION IN OUR PARISH: As we emerge from the Covid period to a new reality, so too our approach to preparation for the sacraments needs to change. We don't have an official line on this in our diocese as yet, but Cardinal Grech, Chair of the European Conference of Bishops, memorably said in 2020 that if after Covid the Church went back to doing what we did before it would be suicide!

There are some radical new ways of thinking on this unfolding in some parishes around the UK as we wait for the bishops to take a lead. We will be a little less radical.

As Parish Priest I ask families and candidates not to come with particular expectations or sense of entitlement to what should happen when: candidates should come to the sacraments when they are ready, and the first step to being ready is that habitual Sunday worship in line with the "Obligation" should be the *established* norm for the families of small children - and the children be part of this - or chosen personally by those of teenage years and above. After that, we can start to look at the base on which to build. If you have any questions or observations, contact Fr James. (*Notice issued March 2022*)
