## SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION IN OUR PARISH:

- **3.** WHITE FLOWER APPEAL 2024: The society for the Protection of Unborn children (SPUC) vision is for a world where abortion is unthinkable. This year appeal calls for the Government to end the pills-by-post DIY abortion policy. As well as ending the lives of precious babies, this policy lacks safeguards against illegal late-term abortions, and puts mothers at physical and psychological risk. 86% of GPs are concerned that this scheme leaves women vulnerable to coerced abortion. Please be as generous as you can to help SPUC defend unborn babies and their mothers by highlighting this urgent crisis.

**"RIGHT TO LIFE UK" NEED OUR HELP:** RTL writes: You may have heard about the recent tragic case of a woman being sent abortion pills by the abortion provider, BPAS, who had not accurately established the gestation of her baby, Lily, who was then aborted at between 32 and 34 weeks, which is around 8 months gestation. Rather than take responsibility for sending out abortion pills 22 weeks beyond the legal limit for athome abortions, BPAS is running a major campaign to fully 'decriminalise' abortion, which would introduce abortion up to birth!

**ABORTION TIME LIMIT AMENDMENT - RIGHT TO LIFE UK:** Ask your MP to support the abortion time limit reduction amendment

Support an amendment to reduce our abortion time limit from 24 weeks to 22 weeks. Research indicates that a significant number of babies born at 22 or 23 weeks can now survive outside the womb, leaving a contradiction in our abortion law.

**Take action:** Collect a postcard today from the back of the church and post it to your MP urgently in support of this amendment!

**COULD YOU BE A FOUNDATION GOVERNOR AT A CATHOLIC SCHOOL?** Foundation Governors are appointed in the name of the Archbishop and form the majority of the governing body of a Catholic school. They have a legal duty to preserve and develop the Catholic character of the school and to ensure that the school is conducted in accordance with its trust deed.

## Governing boards have three core functions:

- 1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- 2. Holding executive leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and
- 3. Overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure its money is well spent.

The ministry of Foundation Governor is an important one, because the Catholic character of our schools depends on committed Catholics being willing to undertake this service. The Archbishop is therefore very appreciative of all those who offer to assist him in this vital task. Because of our baptism, all Christians are all called to serve the Church's mission.

**General Criteria**: To become or remain a foundation governor, a person must be and remain: a practising Catholic; providing education for his or her own children, if of school age, in a Catholic school or college (unless exceptional circumstances apply); able to give priority of attendance at meetings of the governing body to ensure representation of the Archbishop; in possession of a valid DBS disclosure certificate. To become or remain a foundation governor, a person must not be disqualified from becoming or remaining

a governor in accordance with: the current School Government Regulations (or the college's Instrument of Government); the Charities Acts; and the Criminal Justice and Court Services Act 2000.

**Specific Criteria**: In respect of the school or college for which a person is or is to be a foundation governor, he or she must not at any time be: related to any member of the school or college staff, teaching or non-teaching; related to any governor whether elected, appointed or ex-officio, of the school or college; employed (whether as a teacher or otherwise) at the school.

A person (other than the parish priest) will not normally be re-appointed as a foundation governor of a particular school or college if he or she has just completed three consecutive terms on that particular governing body.

**WELCOME TO YOUCAN UK:** We are a religious group for practicing young Catholic adults in the UK, and stay in touch through a network of WhatsApp Groups. Our simple mission is to connect all young Catholic adults with one another. No one can practice their Faith on their own!
