DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: The Second Sunday of Easter is now known throughout the Church as the Sunday of Divine Mercy, the title given by St John Paul II, not as his own idea, but responding to the request made of St Faustina by the Lord Jesus in mystery.



Essentially heaven asks us to center ourselves in a particular way on this Sunday in devotion to the power of his mercy - as a moment of grace to remind ourselves of what should be at the heart of our lives everyday! It is a grace filled expression of the meaning of Easter and a way to

touch sacramentally the Passion, death and Resurrection of the Lord.

We will offer the DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY DEVOTIONS **at 2pm at St Bernard's**, with a time of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and celebrating the "hour of mercy" with the 3pm prayers. Those wishing to make the Divine Mercy devotions should attend their Sunday Mass as normal and make use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the week before or after this Sunday.

3. WHITE FLOWER APPEAL 2024: The society for the Protection of Unborn children (SPUC) vision is for a world where abortion is unthinkable. This year appeal calls for the Government to end the pills-by-post DIY abortion policy. As well as ending the lives of precious babies, this policy lacks safeguards against illegal late-term abortions, and puts mothers at physical and psychological risk. 86% of GPs are concerned that this scheme leaves women vulnerable to coerced abortion. COULD YOU BE A FOUNDATION GOVERNOR AT A CATHOLIC SCHOOL? Foundation Governors are appointed in the name of the Archbishop and form the majority of the governing body of a Catholic school. They have a legal duty to preserve and develop the Catholic character of the school and to ensure that the school is conducted in accordance with its trust deed.

Governing boards have three core functions:

1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
2. Holding executive leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and
3. Overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure its money is well spent.

The ministry of Foundation Governor is an important one, because the Catholic character of our schools depends on committed Catholics being willing to undertake this service. The Archbishop is therefore very appreciative of all those who offer to assist him in this vital task. Because of our baptism, all Christians are all called to serve the Church's mission.

General Criteria: To become or remain a foundation governor, a person must be and remain: a practising Catholic; providing education for his or her own children, if of school age, in a Catholic school or college (unless exceptional circumstances apply); able to give priority of attendance at meetings of the governing body to ensure representation of the Archbishop; in possession of a valid DBS disclosure certificate. To become or remain a foundation governor, a person must not be disqualified from becoming or remaining a governor in accordance with: the current School Government Regulations (or the college's Instrument of Government); the Charities Acts; and the Criminal Justice and Court Services Act 2000.

Specific Criteria: In respect of the school or college for which a person is or is to be a foundation governor, he or she must not at any time be: related to any member of the school or college staff, teaching or non-teaching; related to any governor whether elected, appointed or ex-officio, of the school or college; employed (whether as a teacher or otherwise) at the school.

A person (other than the parish priest) will not normally be re-appointed as a foundation governor of a particular school or college if he or she has just completed three consecutive terms on that particular governing body.

INTRODUCING CATHOLIC LISTENERS:

The helpline is all about listening to others, listening to those who might have become isolated due to the pandemic. This service is based on the LANDINGS ethos of compassionate listening.

Although not a counselling service, the helpline is staffed by a team of volunteers who are trained to signpost callers to other agencies and services.
