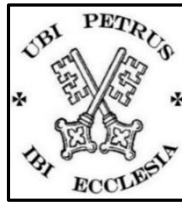

“And He sat dow opposite the treasury, and watched the multitude putting money into the treasury.” (Mk 12.41)

It is customary in the Church to take up a collection during Mass, in some places, mostly at Sunday and other major liturgical celebrations. This collection is essentially part of Mass. Through it, the faithful, in giving back to God a portion of His gift to them, express their gratitude to Him who has given them “every good endowment and every perfect gift” (Jam. 1.17). Together with special collections, donations, Mass offerings, bequests and legacies, and, in some places, tithes, it enables the faithful to fulfil their obligation to support the Church in taking care of its needs (Canon 1262, 1266), and, in doing so, to take ownership of their local church. The Church is neither a business nor a money-making venture, so it depends almost entirely on this voluntary and generous support of its faithful. Through this support, it caters for itself in its material needs, provides the service of love to the poor (2 Cor. 8 & 9), supplies its altar bread and wine and all the other things essential for its liturgical services, provides for the upkeep of its clergy (Mt 10.10; 1 Cor. 9.14; Gal. 6.6; 1 Tim. 5.17-17; Can. 281), pays the wages of its paid personnel, its utility bills, and taxes and insurance premiums on its properties, carries out essential repairs, undertakes its broader mission and apostolate, and supports the Universal Church in its own mission in the world. While this support is purely voluntary, it should also be conscientious according to what each has “decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.” (2 Cor. 9.7) Those who so give freely, gain much more (cf. Lk 6.38); but those who withhold unduly come to poverty (Prov. 11:24). For St Paul, this giving should also be planned: “On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper, so that contributions need not be made when I come.” (1 Cor. 16.2)
