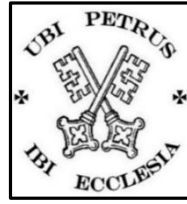

+ 1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT, YEAR C

“. . . look up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.” (Lk 21.28)

The Advent season begins a new ecclesial calendar year. It will be followed by the Christmas Season, a brief spell of the Ordinary Season, Lent, the Easter Season, and the rest of the Ordinary Season. The Church chiefly uses 4 different colours for these and other liturgical celebrations during the year. Purple or violet is used for Advent. Symbolising royalty, it captures the Christian expectancy for the birth of the great King (cf. Jer. 23.5; Zech. 9.9; Mt 2.2; Jn 1.49). As a symbol also for pain, penance, humility, suffering, and sadness, it is used too during Lent to renounce our sinfulness, seek repentance, and do penance, and for the sad occasions of funerals, to mourn loved ones. It is the colour of the skull caps and sashes of bishops. During the Christmas and Easter seasons, the liturgical colour changes to white, the symbol of purity, sanctity, reverence, respect, and virtue. This colour is also used for the feasts of Our Lord (excepting those connected to His suffering and death), Our Lady, the saints who did not die as martyrs, and most of the sacraments. When used for funerals, especially of those who die very old, it points to the resurrection. It can be replaced with gold – a symbol of joy, majesty, and great value. It is the traditional colour of the pope's cassock, skull cap, and sash. Red is the colour of fire and symbolises the burning fire of God's love, the presence of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2.3-4), blood, passion, and martyrdom. It is used for the feasts of the Holy Spirit, the Passion of Our Lord, Palm Sunday, the Triumph of the Cross, Confirmation, and the feasts of martyrs. It is also the colour that cardinals use for their skull caps and sashes. Green which symbolises vegetation, life, hope, and renewal, is used during the Ordinary Season to remind us that we are marching in hope towards the fullness of life with Christ in heaven. This sequence of the use of the liturgical colours goes back to the outline given by Pope Innocent III in 1198.
