+ EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - YEAR A

"They saw the Child, and falling to their knees, they did Him homage." $(Jn\ 1.14)$

Epiphany translates the Greek word, epiphaneia, and means 'an appearing' or 'a manifestation'. We use it for the revealing of Jesus as the Messiah and the Saviour of the world, the prophet whom God promised through Moses He would send His people (Deut. 18.15,18; Acts 3.22; 7.37). For centuries the Israelites waited for this Messiah, expecting Him to come in a way that would identify Him unmistakably. Contrary to that expectation, the Messiah came in the form of a servant, being born in our likeness (Phil. 2.7). In great humility, He concealed His divinity and glory by the poverty of His humanity, and His eternity by the mortality of our flesh that He assumed. Without manifesting Himself, especially to the eyes of faith, the divine Saviour and God the world awaited could not be recognised in the helpless baby of Bethlehem, in the humble child and young man of Nazareth, and in the itinerant preacher who went about in all Israel teaching the mysteries of God. Even with the eyes of faith, it is still impossible to see Him in this life as He really is; the vision of His glory is possible only in the full glow of the beatific vision (1 Jn 3.2). But lest in the meantime we be deprived entirely of this vision, He gave us glimpses of His glory on several occasions – at His nativity when the angels appeared and announced His birth to the shepherds (Lk 2.9-14); in the guidance of the Magi by a star (Mt 2.1-12); at the wedding in Cana (Jn 2.11); during His baptism at River Jordan when the Father bore witness to Him from heaven (Mt 3.16-17); in His transfiguration (Mt 17.1-8; 2 Pt 1.17-18); and in the miracles He worked. These epiphanies invite us at this time to contemplate and worship our God and Saviour in the child who was born to us.
