"Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into His glory?" (Luke 24.26)

Our Lord's saving passion started in the evening of Holv Thursday, ending in His death on a cross on Good Friday. During that time, and throughout the following day, when Life was killed and remained in death, it was all doom and gloom, the kind the world has never seen, and the darkness that reigned over all was so great. Then the Easter Sunday morning dawned, and, with it, everything radically changed. In an instant, death was swallowed up in life, and night by day; light displaced darkness; gloom turned to hope; doom gave way to joy unparalleled, captivity to freedom, enmity to peace, failure to victory, and death to life; conquering, love arose triumphant. At the time of the passion, people witnessed to only the pain and the suffering; not even the apostles, the closest friends of the innocent Victim, could see through the pain, the shame, and the disaster of the passion. By hindsight, we are now able to see the necessity of the passion, that salvation and glory were designed to flow from it. And, so, the jubilant Church, exceedingly joyful in its experience of that outcome, proudly sings at Easter Vigil of the "truly necessary sin of Adam", and of a "happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer." At the moment, we see mostly the pain and misery of the coronavirus pandemic. We are not sure what will come out of it. But we do recognise with other people that, after the pandemic, the world will not be the same again. What the final outcome will be, we do not know; but we hope it will be positive, and that each one of us can learn from the pandemic and be able to shape the future of the world with an experience of love, solidarity, and faith in God.
