### + 12<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY - YEAR B

Let the little children come to Me, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven. (Matthew 19.14)

In 2007 the then Pope, Benedict XVI, initiated the reform of Book IV of the 1983 Code of Canon Law to bring the Penal Law of the Church into line with the reality of the Church's contemporary experience. The reform was necessary and urgent due to the Church's experience of serious scandals in recent times. It sought to make the "universal penal norms ever more suitable for the protection of the common good and of the individual faithful, and more congruent with the demands of justice." Following 12 years of an intense work by the Pontifical Council for Legislative Texts, and extensive worldwide consultations with dioceses and legal experts, the reform was promulgated on Pentecost Sunday this year by Pope Francis. It modified 63 (71%) of the 89 canons of Book IV, removed 9 (10%) of them, and left 17 (19%). It focused mostly on sexual abuse, women ordination, and financial malfeasance. It put together child sexual abuse (including grooming) and the sexual abuse of disabled or vulnerable persons as crimes against human life, dignity, and liberty, and attaches strict penalties to those. It affirms that the crime can be committed not only by a cleric, but also by a religious or layperson in authority in the Church, and so it is also an abuse of authority. It imposes automatic excommunication on a bishop who attempts conferring Sacred Orders on a woman, as well as on the woman who receives that attempted conferral. It also stipulates strict penalties for any cleric who misappropriates any funds in his charge. The reform is due and welcome and furthers the Church's zero-tolerance of certain offenses any of its officials may commit.
