# + 18<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY – YEAR B

# You seek Me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. (John 6.26)

Everything Our Lord said and did has more than one level of meaning and significance. Underneath its surface meaning and import easily understood by the sensuous carnal person is usually something deeper and spiritual that is not readily apparent. For carnal persons, Our Lord's words and actions only pertain to earthly existence like food and drink (Rom. 14.17) and have no spiritual significance (1 Cor. 2.14). Their vision is limited to earthly life and revolves around satisfying their immediate desires and material needs. They do not open up themselves to the guidance of the Spirit Thus the perception of those who ate the loaves the Lord gave them was all about material bread and how to satisfy their physical hunger. They failed to realise that the bread they ate which satisfied their immediate hunger was in fact a sign of the true Bread from heaven (Jn 6.32) – the Bread of Life (Jn 6.35) – which quenches the flames of passion, nourishes with grace all those who eat it, and prepares them for eternal life (Jn 6.50-51). They could not understand that it is the spirit that gives life, the flesh is of no avail, that the words Our Lord had spoken to them are spirit and life (Jn 6.63). On the other hand, being led by the Spirit, and walking also by the Spirit (Gal. 5.26), spiritual persons look beyond the apparent and see what lies beneath. They see that this life and everything in it are pointers to eternal life. They understand that behind and beyond the transient visible realities around them are the eternal realities to which they are called. For them, therefore, the Break that is broken, shared, and eaten is but the sign of the banquet of the eternal life of heaven.

**<u>NEW COVID GUIDELLINE</u>**: From the 19<sup>th</sup>, the following guideline applies:

• The obligation to attend Sunday Mass will be reinstated beginning from November the 28<sup>th</sup>, the first Sunday of Advent;

- The local situation will determine the level of restriction to be put in place;
- Mitigating measures will continue wearing of masks while inside the church; sanitising hands on entering and on leaving the church; cleaning and properly ventilating the church;
- Opening the church all day for private prayers;
- Social distancing is no longer mandatory;
- Test, Track and Trace: Continued use of QR codes and contact cards;
- One-way system and movement no longer necessary; caution to be taken;
- Congregational singing to resume; the congregation to wear mask. From next Sunday, hymn books will return to the shelves;
- The services of Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Altar Servers, Choir, and all the usual ministers at Mass will resume;
- Offertory Collection can now be taken the usual way;
- Physical Sign of Peace remains suspended;
- Holy Communion to remain under one kind and may be received on the tongue;
- Any number of people can attend the celebration of baptism, confirmation, wedding, funeral;
- Social and catechetical activities in person can resume.
