Who do you say I am?Mk 8:29.

Under David and his son Solomon, the 12 tribes of Israel were united as one nation. In the 1000 years that followed between the time of David and Solomon and the coming of Jesus, the Jewish people, as divided nations were conquered by various superpowers. The Assyrians cleaned out the Northern Kingdom in the 8th Century, the Babylonians conquered the Southern Kingdom of Judah in the 6th century and destroyed the temple. The Persians in 614 CE, the Greeks in the wake of Alexander the great in 330 CE and the Romans in 63 CE. Therefore, it's understandable that the Jewish people at the time of Jesus reminisced about the time of David and Solomon as the golden age of their history. Thus, the warm expectation of the messiah who would restore the kingdom of David, and set them free from Pegan Rome. Jesus admits to his apostles following Peter's declaration, that he was in fact, the Messiah. However, he waists no time in correcting any wrong ideas of a political leader the apostles might have. He immediately foretold the sufferings and death he would have to endure at the hands of the leaders of the Jews. He would be conquered and humiliated by his enemies but their victory would be short-lived -- death would not hold him -- he would rise triumphant on the third day. This warning was repeated twice later (Mk 9:9-10, 10:32-34), but yet, it was only vaguely grasped by his followers. After they were convinced by the event of the resurrection, they then realized that their beloved Master was more than Messiah, that he was in fact the Son of God, who with knowledge aforethought freely accepted his humiliations and shameful death for their sakes and ours. They gladly gave their lives to bringing this news of God's great love for men to all nations. From being a scandal, the cross became the emblem and the proud standard of God's love for mankind.
