"This text is being fulfilled as you listen" Lk 421.

Jeremiah was charged with an impossible assignment. He was charged with the responsibility of bringing a message of doom, an impending threat of invasion from Babylon. The people of Israel had one of two choices to make. They were to turn back to God and be saved or trust in their own feeble manoeuvrings and be doomed to slaughter and exile. This message was blocked from getting to the masses by the powers of the day by dumping Jeremiah in the squelchy mud of a near empty well. Silencing Jeremiah however, did not stop the Babylonians from advancing and destroying the city and the temple of Jerusalem. Wounded and exiled, they learned the hard way; in the words of the prophet, "God took from them the heart of stone and gave them a heart of flesh. The response from the villagers of Nazareth to Jesus' claim he has come to proclaim the good news to the poor, and the disadvantaged was very similar to those of Jeremiah's days. It is familiar. We have all been witnesses to people failing to recognize other's talents for various selfish reasons. Although they wanted to keep benefiting from Jesus' miraculous healings, they would not accept his message. This rejection did not do much to stop the message from spreading to the ends of the earth. For as St Paul says in todays 2nd reading, True love has no limits. Because Jesus' message was inspired by true love for humanity, it could never be stopped, only those who rejected it would deny themselves of its blessings.
