+ THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, SOL.

READINGS: 1. Apoc. 11:19,12:1-6,10; 2. 1Cor. 15:20-26. 3. Gospel: Luke 1.39-56. Psalm: Ps 44(45):10-12,16: On you right stands the queen, in garments of gold. Alleluia! Alleluia!! Mary has been taken up to heaven; all the choirs of angels are rejoicing. Alleluia!.

REFLECTION: In the Churches' Year of Grace, Pius Parsch wrote regarding Assumption: "Now toward the end of the summer season, at a time when fruits are ripe in the gardens and fields, the Church celebrates the most glorious 'harvest festival' in the Communion of Saints. Mary, the supremely blessed one among women, Mary, the most precious fruit which has ripened in the fields of God's kingdom, is today taken into the granary of heaven".

All the feast days of Mary mark the great mysteries of her life and her part in the work of redemption. The central mystery of her life and person is her divine motherhood, celebrated both at Christmas and a week later (Jan. 1) on the feast of the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. The Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8) marks the preparation for that motherhood, so that she had the fullness of grace from the first moment of her existence, completely untouched by sin. Her whole being throbbed with divine life from the very beginning, readying her for the exalted role of mother of the Saviour.

The Assumption completes God's work in her since it was not fitting that the flesh that had given life to God himself should ever undergo corruption. The Assumption is God's crowning of His work as Mary ends her earthly life and enters eternity. The feast turns our eyes in that direction, where we will follow when our earthly life is over.

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they do not look only to the past. They look to the present and to the future and give us an insight into our own relationship with God. The Assumption looks to eternity and gives us hope that we, too, will follow Our Lady when our life is ended.
