

READINGS: 1. Wisdom 9:13-18; 2. St Paul to Philemon 9-10. 12-17; Gospel Luke 14:25-33. Psalm: Ps 89:3-6. 12-14.17 O Lord, you have been our refuge from one generation to the next. Alleluia! Alleluia!! I call you friends, says the Lord, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father, Alleluia!

REFLECTION: Accessing the Cost of Discipleship: Ours is a society that is driven by the market economy; thus, it is not a surprise that Christian evangelists feel the need to portray Christianity in the marketplace of competing ideologies and cultures. The consequence of this reality is that the Christian mission is therefore presented as a low-cost, low risk commodity, a better offer so to say, in order to attract buyers. In todays Gospel, Jesus in no uncertain terms, makes it clear that the Christian faith is not a low-risk endeavour.

Nothing less than absolute allegiance is acceptable to Jesus in a disciple (Lk 14:25-33). With two brief stories, Jesus drives home the message that although salvation is free, it is also very expensive, the disciple is called to give up all to Jesus. A literal reading of the passage could lead one to wonder why Jesus would call us to hate our biological families. But just as in Matthew 18:8-9, Jesus is employing hyperbolic expression to drive home his message. In this case, the stark language of hate is deployed to pass the message of primary allegiance, a question of where one's treasure is which determines where one's heart also shall be.

When Jesus made these demands, he was clear about the passion that lay ahead of him, thus was only preparing the disciples to hold on to his own determination. We must count the cost before beginning to build the tower. Most Christians have already started to build with occasional doubts whether they are able to stay the course. There is looking back once hand is laid on the plough, only prayers for courage to remain loyal and steadfast.

Jesus Said: "My house shall be called a house of prayer." Before Mass - Talk to God. During Mass - Listen to God. After Mass - Talk to each other.
