+27th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Yr C.

READINGS: 1. Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4; 2. St Paul to Timothy 1:6-8.13-14; Gospel Luke 17:5-10. Psalm: Ps 94:1-2.6-9. O that today you would listen to his voice! Harden not your hearts. Alleluia! Alleluia!! Speak, Lord, your servant is listening: you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

REFLECTION: Increase our faith. Today's Gospel is part of a larger unit of sayings (7:1-10) that concludes the second phase of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem in Luke (13:22-17:10). In the sayings immediately preceding this text, Jesus cautions his disciples not to be the reason for others to take offense at the gospel message (7:10; 7:23). He also gives counsel on how to deal with a fellow disciple who sins: that person is to be rebuked, and if repentance follows, this same person is to be forgiven — even if forgiveness is needed again and again (17:3-4). Given the challenging nature of these sayings, and the rest of what Jesus has to say about following him, it is not surprising that the disciples appeal to Jesus:

"Increase our faith!" (17:5). Elsewhere Jesus has described what it means to follow him in exacting terms. To a would-be follower, he cautions that the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head. To those who want to follow him but first take care of family matters, he says that they need to keep the kingdom of God as their first priority without wavering or looking back (9:57-62). To the request to increase their faith, Jesus makes a point that they have all the faith they need. He seemed to say; you will grow in faith as you act in faith. Every gift of God is strengthened by the exercise of it, and this is true of faith. One word of caution: Just as the ordinary foot soldier sees too little to know how well or badly the battle is going, the ordinary Christian also has limited vision. The early Christians who were dying on crosses alongside the roads or in the Coliseum were acting in faith, and some may have felt that God had betrayed their faith. We can now see that their blood was not shed in vain, but instead became the manure that promoted the church's strong growth. Faith means believing even when the outcome seems in doubt.
