READINGS: 1. Isaiah 2:1-5; 2. St Paul to the Romans 13:11-14; Gospel Matthew 24:37-44. Psalm: 121:1-2.4-5.6-9. I rejoiced when I heard them say: "Let us go to God's house." Alleluia! Alleluia!! Let us see, O Lord, your mercy and give us your saving help. Alleluia!

REFLECTION: Dear Friends, today, we start a new liturgical season of Advent, which is a season of hope because it is filled with hopeful expectation for the coming of the King whose reign will usher peace, love and justice. The word Advent comes from the Latin word "Adventus" which means "to come." Liturgically, it denotes a season of preparation for the celebration of the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Consequently, just as it is necessary to prepare for the coming of any important personality; so, the coming of Christ as king calls for adequate preparation as well.

Advent calls us to look both backward and forward. Hence, we look backward to commemorate the coming of Christ two thousand years ago. Secondly, we look forward for his second coming. The season renews our hope and grow in patience so as not to grow weary but to trust in God to whom thousand years is like a day.

When it comes to waiting on God, the virtue of patience is necessary, which is the capacity to wait for something or endure something tedious without getting angry or upset is a valuable quality to acquire. We are called not to be like the Israelites who lost patience while waiting for Moses to come down from the mountain. Abraham is an exemplary figure of patience who waited for many years on God to fulfil his promise to him. May this season enable us grow in the virtue of patience in this world of speed and anxiety through Christ.
