## +33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C.

READINGS: 1. Malachi 3:19-20; 2. St Paul to Thessalonians 3:7-12; Gospel Luke 21:5-19. Psalm: 97:5-9. The Lord comes to rule the peoples with fairness. Alleluia! Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to stand with confidence before the Son of Man. Alleluia!

**REFLECTION:** Dear Pilgrims, the readings invite us to prepare for the second coming of our Lord and to be aware of fake prophets who will use the moment to deceive. The second coming was proclaimed by Christ himself in the bible and we profess it in our creed that "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead." As we draw near to the end of the liturgical year, it becomes expedient to reflect on what attitude should such moment awaken in us?

The second coming of Christ could be liken to an examination which has no fixed date and time. Therefore, to pass such examination, one has to be ever prepared to avoid being taken unaware. Similarly, we should prepare for our Lord's coming since we do not know the day by deepening of our relationship with God through frequent prayer. Also, living life based on his commandments, purifying ourselves through regular confession, frequent attendance of the Holy Mass and being charitable.

We should be aware of fake prophets who have interpreted events in the world like the corona virus, the year 2000, the world wars and calamities etc as what will precede the Lord's coming which caused panic, lost of property and death. To these fake prophets Jesus clearly stated "neither the angels nor the Son of man knows." Above all, the biblical predications of ugly and strange events preceding the end time should not cause us to panic thus the first reading states "but for those who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will arise with healing in its wings." Instead, the moment calls for calm, joy and jubilation. Therefore, let us go about our daily activities with hearts set on the things above so that the moment will find us willing and ready.

Jesus Said: "My house shall be called a house of prayer." Before Mass - Talk to God, During Mass - Listen to God, After Mass - Talk to each other.
