+4th Sunday of Advent, Year A Sunday, 18th December 2022

READINGS: 1. Isaiah 7:10-14; 2. St Paul to the Romans 1:1-7; Gospel Matthew 1:18-24. Psalm: 23:1-6. Let the Lord enter! He is the king of glory. Alleluia! Alleluia!! The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel, a name which means 'God-is-with-us.' Alleluia!

REFLECTION:

Today is the last Sunday of Advent and we are gradually approaching the celebration of the nativity of our Lord. In the First reading from the Prophet Isaiah, God gave us the most definitive sign about the Messiah thus "a maiden is with child and will soon give birth to a son whom shall be call Emmanuel which means God is with us." It is important to note that this sign was given to King Ahaz only after he humbled himself by refusing to put God to test. The lessons here is that some times, we prefer our own Will instead of God's Will. We should allow God to be God without trying to pre-empt him but let his Will be done in our life. Secondly, if we humble ourselves before God, He will reveal to us the mysteries of his ways.

In the gospel, the focus shifts from John the Baptist towards Mary and Joseph.

The infancy narrative highlights the central role they played. Thus, they were human instruments God used in actualizing his divine plan. Despite the doubts, shame and confusion that were experienced at the extraordinary case of Mary's pregnancy. They submitted themselves to the mysterious workings of God, allowing God to actualize his own plan of salvation in his own way and manner. This is to teach us that God is ever active in our history and He comes to us through human agency and needs us to cooperate with Him. Are we ready and Willing like Mary and Joseph to cooperate with God to Save, support and protect humanity?

O Lord, the house of my soul is narrow; enlarge it that you may enter in. It is ruinous, O repair it. Cleanse me from secret faults, O Lord. St Augustine.
