## REFLECTION:

Today, the Church presents to us through the prophetic insights of Isaiah and John the Baptist, the: "Agnus Dei, qui tollit Peccata Mundi (Lamb of God, who takes away the Sins of the World)". This Lamb of God carried out with perfect obedience the Will of the Father which includes establishing his kingdom on earth, bringing sinners back to God, releasing the captive and dying for the sins of the world. Therefore, we are called to pause and ask ourselves this Sunday, "as one chosen by God by the virtue of my baptism, am I making any effort to do the Will of God?

From this moment, John will decrease while Christ will increase by beginning his public ministry. Like John, what more does God expect from us than to lead others who have not known Jesus to Him. Through your advice to those in need you can help them to know Christ, the kind of gift you give can help others grow spiritually, your approach and manner of living can do the miracle in others to encounter Christ. All we need to do is to accept to do the Will of God and the Holy Spirit will guide us and give us the enablement. May the Holy Spirit guide our lives along the right path. Amen.
