READINGS: 1. Isaiah 8:23-9:3; 2. St Paul to the Corinthians 1:10-13.17; Gospel Matthew 4:12-23. Psalm: 26:1.4.13-14. Psalm. The Lord is my light and my help. Alleluia! Alleluia!! Jesus proclaimed the Good News of the kingdom and cured all kinds of sickness among the people. Alleluia!

REFLECTION:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, today, both the first reading and the gospel opine thus: "the people who walk in darkness have seen a great light..." This statement encapsulates the mission of lesus as he begins his public ministry around the sea of Galilee which is the ideal site because of it's cosmopolitan nature and a Gentile territory. He brought the light of God to a darkened world through his life, action and preaching. He also called Peter, Andrew, James and John to be his followers (Apostles). These men left everything behind and followed him to become his lightbearers to the world. The Apostles in-turn begets us who are the new Israelites and Christ lightbearers in our contemporary world. Thus the hymn "Light of Christ, light our way, light our way as we go" challenges us.

To radiate this light to others, we must try and be united among ourselves under one God, one faith, one Church, live honestly and support each other in love which are a testimonies of who we are. This is what the second reading invites us thus "I urge you brethren... that you agree among yourself in what you say and that there be no division among you, but be united in mind and heart." We are called to know that united we will stand and succeed, but if divided, we will fall. Secondly, by believing and proclaiming with conviction the good news of Christ which is the gospel of peace, hope, joy, healing, victory and salvation to others. This gospel is the power of God which gives us the courage to transform our lives and the wisdom on how to live as sons and daughters of God. May our lives be guided by the light of Christ. Amen
